Rodeo Opens Tonight

A&M's 43rd annual All-Aggie Rodeo will get underway today, Friday and Saturday at the university rodeo arena with the first performance beginning at 8 p.m. Friday night's show will also start at 8 o'clock while the Saturday show will be staged at 2 p.m., due to the A&M-Texas Tech football game.

Sponsored by the Saddle and Sirolo Club, the rodeo will feature six riding and roping events and will include an open girls barrel race.

The annual show has slated bareback bronc riding, bull riding, tie down calf roping, ribbon roping and steer wrestling along with the barrel race.

Prizes will be awarded for each go-around on a first, second and third-place basis and belt buckles will be given for over-all winners after Saturday's performance.

Prize money will be mailed out this year after the rodeo, a rodeo spokesman said.

National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association rules will be followed throughout the rodeo, except in choosing the All-Around Cowboy.

The rodeo is open to all Aggies, university faculty members and farm employees.

McBride Brothers, of Dallas will furnish the stock for the show and Ronnie Patterson of Lamesa will be the announcer.

Bulls and broncs drew the great-

est number with 39 riders slated in the bull riding. The chute will open 30 times for broncs.

Danny, Lloyd Top Gainers

Aggies Host BU In Cross Country

Coach Charlie Thomas' Aggie cross country delegation will make its first appearance of the season when it hosts the Baylor Bears Friday in a two-mile meet at 5 p.m. on the A&M cross country course.

Leading the Maroon distance men will be team captains Danny Clifton, Geoffrey Earl and Don Smith—all sophomores.

The four other runners to battle the Bears will be Bob Smith of El Paso, Noel Adams of Alvin, Bill Turney of Houston and Johnnie Cosper of Edna. All but Turney are sophomores.

Captain Clifton is a 1963 Class B mile champion while Earl was clocked in the mile at 4:28.0 his freshman year. Don Smith, who



When the Aggies and the Texas Tech Red Raiders meet up for the kickoff Saturday in Kyle Field, it will be the 10th meeting of the two teams, but only the fifth contest played at Aggie Field. Most popular site in the past has been in Antonio, where eight were played. Five have been in Lubbock, four in Dallas and one in Amarillo...

The Aggie-Raider tilt will also be a homecoming and friends night. Tech Coach J. T. King was twice an assistant at A&M along with Raider Coach Matt Lair. Aggie Coach Hank Foldberg along with aides Leonard Brown, Joel Foldberg, Neil Schmidt, Craig Randall and Dick Johnson were coaches at Wichita University along with Tech assistant coach Neil Green...

There have also been some hair-raising plays made in the two schools met. In 1962 the Aggies were behind, 17-19 with 19 seconds left in the game when Maroon halfback Danny McIlhany, now starting at quarterback, raced 103 yards on a kickoff return and A&M won, 7-3...

Aggie records by the numbers have been produced, clashes with Texas Tech and include: most rushes in a game, 31 by Bob Smith in 1949, who also had the longest Aggie touchdown run from scrimmage, 81-yards, in the game; most yards rushing, 400, by an Aggie team in the longest punt by an Aggie, 86 yards, by Bobby Goff in 1944.

The Aggie Lettermen's Lounge, being constructed in Rollie White Coliseum, will not be open for the Texas Tech game Saturday. Athletic Director Hank Foldberg said the official opening of the lounge, which will serve as a place for all A&M lettermen to meet, will be the weekend of the TCU encounter...

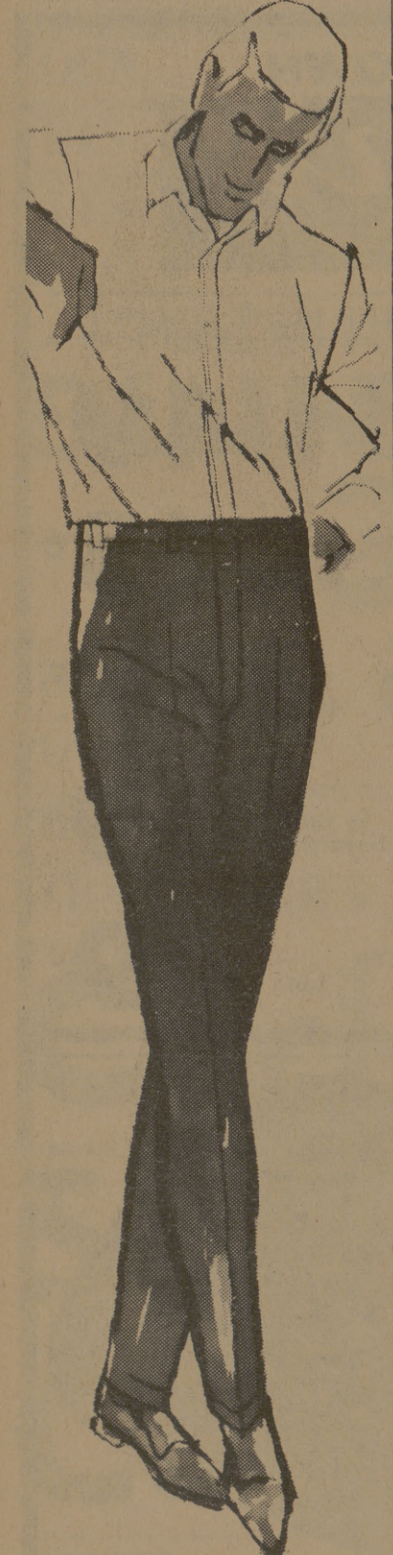
