Abbott Gives 'Last Lecture' On Re-learning

Advice on what college students should do to prepare for a continuation of education was given Monday by Dr. John P. Abbott in the "Last Lecture" series in the YMCA.

From now on we must be consciously alert for the need of re-learning," said Abbott as he asked a greater need for a continuation of education.

Delivered as if it were his last lecture to a group of students,

Abbott's speech stressed studying each course as it relates to life in general. "Different courses of study are only different approaches to the study of life in all its manifestations," Abbott said.

Abbott stated that for a complete study of life the student must:

- Absorb each event that happens to him.
- Assimilate each happening as a part of his experience.

Assess each experience for its value.

Apply this new knowledge to every day life.

"Nothing is worse than 'inert' knowledge," concluded Abbott.

The next speaker for the "Last Lecture" series will be Dr. H. O. Kunkel, associate director of the Agricultural Experiment Station. This series is held at 6 p.m. each Monday through Nov. 2 in the YMCA Building.

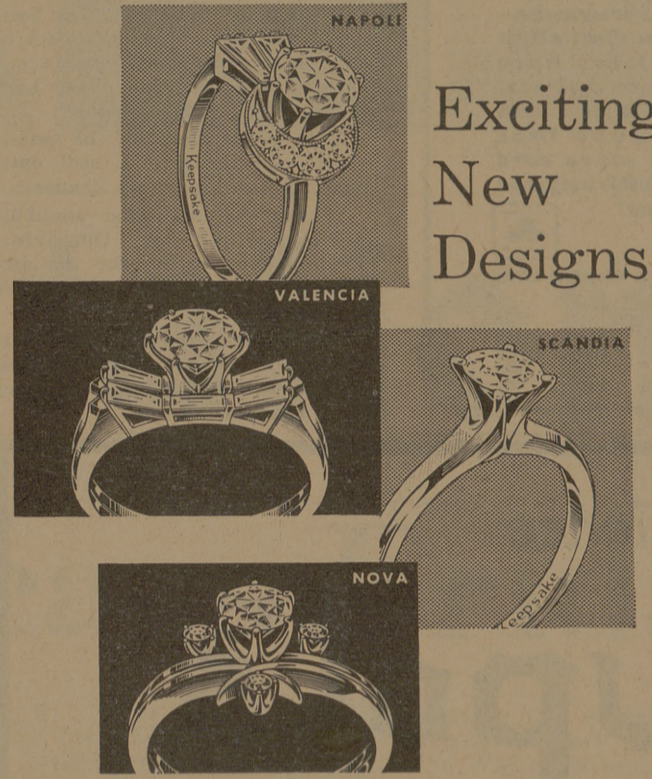
CORPS SENIOR & 1ST SERGEANTS YEARBOOK PORTRAIT SCHEDULE

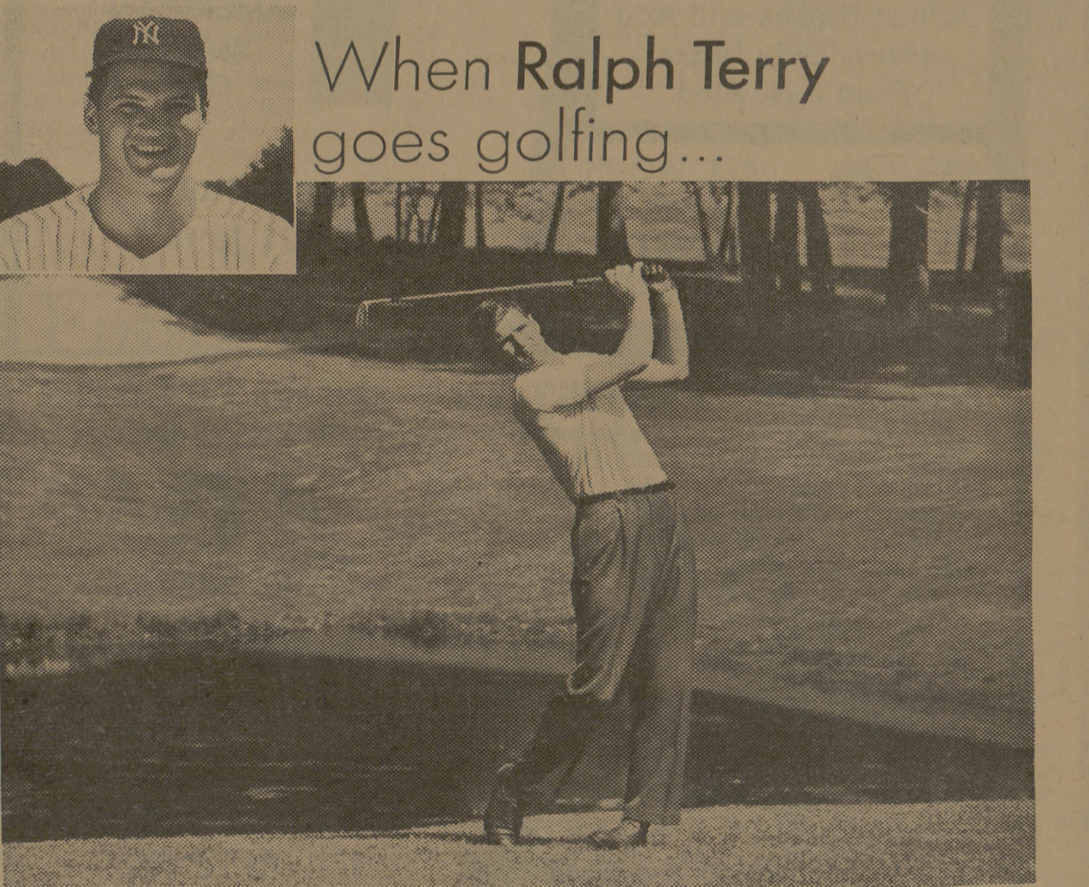
