their Silver Anniversary reunion this weekend and will be honored at halftime.

The Cadets will be seeking their first win over the Frogs since a 7-0 decision in 1957. The Ags have scored 14 points in each of the past four contests with TCU.

Saturday's game will pit two of the league's top passers against each other. The Ags boast Dan McIlhane, the Southwest Conference's top chucker after four games.

Frog Kent Nix completed 19 of 38 against Texas Tech last weekend and shot to third place in the conference quarterback derby.

Earlier in the week, A&M taskmaster Hank Foldberg warned against taking the Purples lightly.

"They still have the big, strong line which has become a TCU trademark," said Foldberg, "and

they have a sound passing game when Nix is healthy. Jim Fauver is a real good boy and Larry Bulaich can hurt you up the middle."

Fauver will be the third straight halfback ace the Ags have faced. Two weeks ago, Donny Anderson from Texas Tech riddled the Cadet flanks for 129 yards and a touchdown.

Last Saturday, USC ace Mike Garrett rambled for 121 yards and two six-pointers.

Fauver, a 185-pound senior speedster, is the Frogs' prime offensive weapon. The Houston Milby product ranks second in the league in rushing. He may be hampered by an injury Saturday.

The big guns in the Frog trenches also line up on offense. Ken Henson, a 245-pound mammoth center, anchors the forward wall. Guard Steve Garmon and Tackle Norman Evans are other key cogs.

The oddsmakers have tabbed the Fort Worth team as favorites despite the identical records of the two clubs.

If the Ags are going to upset the pollsters they must shake the offensive doldrums which have plagued them this season.

Foldberg may make several last minute line-up changes in an effort to come up with a winning combination.

Last year's contest wound up in a 14-14 deadlock. Tackle Bill Ward blocked a punt in that tilt and carried it 20 yards to tilt the score for the Aggies.

Statistically, the two clubs are remarkably even. The Ags have racked up 45 first downs thus far and the Frogs 51.

The Cadets have picked up 489 yards through the airways to

TCU's 480. The Frogs have allowed 763 yards rushing against them and the Aggies 710.

If Fauver is healthy, he and Ag Phil Scoggin will continue their torrid punting duel. Each has averaged just over 37 yards a kick on the ones that haven't been blocked.

Next week the Frogs return home for a date with Clemson. The Ags journey to Waco for an afternoon game with Baylor.

A crowd of 15-20,000 is expected for Saturday's 1:30 p.m. kickoff.

Porker-Steer Tilt In Austin Heads SWC Weekend Slate

By HAROLD V. RATLIF (P) - For five straight years the Texas-Arkansas game has been the most decisive in the Southwest Conference football race.

Saturday night at Austin it again will be the big one and will be on national import since it matches Texas, No. 1 and Arkansas, No. 8, in a battle that could be the eventual payoff in the conference race as well as a springboard to the national top spot for Arkansas.

In the past five years Texas has won two championships and tied for two. Arkansas has won one and tied for two. The Texas-

Arkansas game has been the most important of them all.

A sellout crowd of 65,700 will watch the two titans of the league fight it out in Memorial Stadium while the other members of the conference have their comparatively private gridiron parties.

Southern Methodist and Rice, each with a disappointing 1-2 season record, open the conference race in Dallas' Cotton Bowl Saturday night.

The winner will be tied with the Texas-Arkansas victor for the league lead.

Texas Tech seeks to hang in there close in a battle with win-

less Baylor at Waco.

Texas goes after its 16th victory in a row-the longest skid in major college football at the time. Arkansas is bouncing back from a 5-5 season and doing a startling job of it under the expert guidance of Fred Marshall and the damaging punt returns of Ken Hatfield.

The game also will match the most accurate kickers in the league - David Conway of Texas and Tom McKnelly of Arkansas. Each has booted 13 extra points and each has two field goals. So a close, tense ball game might settle down to a kicking duel.

Randy To Throw

Aggie weightman Randy Matson will compete in the Olympic shot put late Friday night.

Matson's greatest competition should come from his U.S. teammates, Dallas Long and Parry O'Brien.

The Pampa strongman has an all-time peak throw of 65'5 1/2", recorded earlier this year in a California meet.

The Los Angeles Angels capitalized on two pinch-hit home runs this year. Jim Fregosi hit one on May 6th to beat Minnesota and Tom Satriano hit one in New York on Sept. 16 to beat the Yankees.
