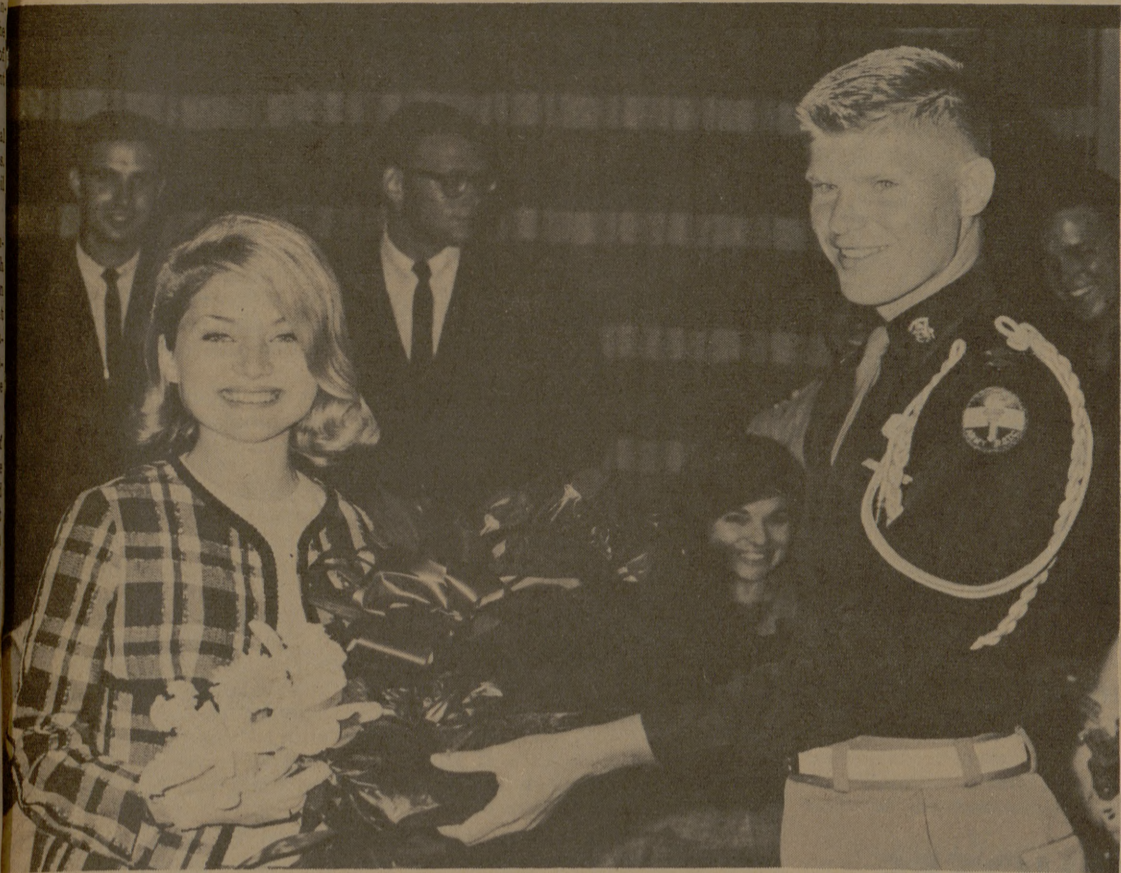


The Weekend: Wonderful For Some People . . .

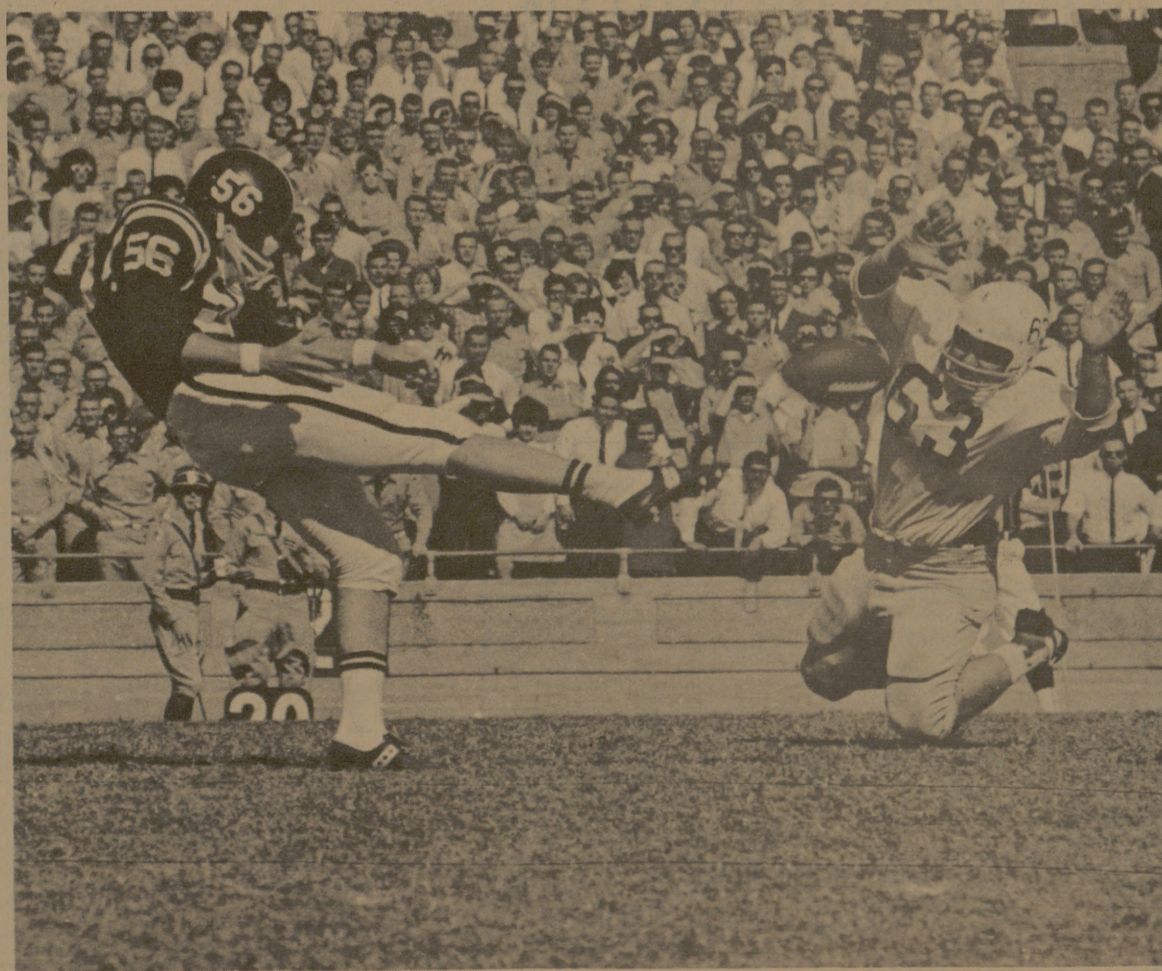
