Navy Seeking Prospects For Reserves

Students who would like to earn a commission in the Navy while attending A&M are being sought for the Navy Reserve Officer Candidate program said Lt. G. E. Bayliss, Commanding Officer, NR Naval Security Group Division 8-19.

Information about this program can be obtained at Room 320, Nagle Hall, any Monday evening between 7:15 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. Applications for the ROTC program are being accepted until 15 January, 1965, but interested persons should investigate the program earlier, according to Bayliss, because the Eighth Naval District quota is limited.

Upon being accepted, candidates spend two eight-week summer periods at Newport, Rhode Island in training. Upon graduation from college they receive a commission as Ensign, USNR. "Aggies now on active duty who receive ROC training while in college are now at such diverse places as Argentina, Newfoundland and Pearl Harbor," said Bayliss.

While members of the ROC program students belong to the Naval Reserve and are paid for attending weekly meetings here on the campus. Bayliss pointed out that reserve participation results in ROC Ensigns going on active duty with several years of longevity with resultant increases in pay.

X-Ray Technicians Course Offered By Civil Defense

A 30-hour course for radiological monitor instructors will be held Nov. 9-12 in College Station, announced Dr. Willis R. Bodine, coordinator of Civil Defense Training at A&M.

Jake Canglose, director of Civil Defense for Brazos County, will be in charge of local arrangements for the course. No fees will be

charged, but persons interested are asked to pre-register with the local CD office.

Key personnel from telephone cooperative throughout the state are expected for the Texas State-wide Cooperative Telephone Plant School Thursday and Friday at the Research Annex.

Don Hall, director of the school, estimated 75 to 80 persons will attend the school which will feature four workshops.

Pay station maintenance, carrier maintenance, changes in REA construction contracts, and instrument maintenance are the workshop subjects.

In addition, Charles Suche, toll engineer for Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. in Uvalde; Harry Cagle, supervisor of the development program for communications training, and Reagan Brown, extension rural sociologist, will speak on selected subjects.

Mrs. Jane C. Berry, Extension home furnishings specialist in Oklahoma for the past year, will join the headquarters staff of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service on Nov. 1 as housing and home furnishings specialist.

In making the announcement, Extension Director John E. Hutchison said that Mrs. Berry will be located at A&M and will give leadership in the overall housing and home furnishings programs of the state. She will fill the post vacated more than a year ago by Charlotte Tompkins, who accepted an Extension position in Alaska.

Five Collegiate FFA members with their co-advisor will appear before the Education 681 Seminar at 4 p.m. Oct. 27 in Room 401-03 of the Academic Building.

Britons Face Stiff Increases On All Manufactured Imports

LONDON, (AP)—Britons resigned themselves today to stiff price increases on manufactured imports as a result of the Labor government's new 15 per cent surcharge to cut buying abroad.

Traders on the European continent and in Ireland expressed alarm that the crash action of Prime Minister Harold Wilson's new Labor government would sharply reduce their lucrative flow of exports to Britain. Wilson's experts anticipated imports would be cut about \$560 million a year.

In Washington, the U. S. Treasury commended the plan as a prompt and effective way to protect the stability of the pound sterling. The surcharge will apply to about 50 per cent of the \$1.5 billion worth of goods the

United States sells to Britain each year.

The surcharge affects all imports except food, raw materials and raw tobacco. At 15 per cent, cost of the items involved will rise about three shillings - 42 cents - to the pound - \$2.80. But economists believe that after sales taxes and retailers' profits the actual increase will be closer to 20 per cent.

The surcharge was the main step the government announced Monday in an emergency program designed to check Britain's widening balance of payments—the difference between what the nation earns abroad and what it buys. To spur exports, the government promised exporters tax rebates ranging from 1 to 3 per cent.
