

Holiday Power Cutoff Set

The University's electrical power will be curtailed during the Thanksgiving holidays, Howard Budget, director of physical plants, has announced. This will allow the new power

equipment to be tied in with the existing facilities, he added. "Before leaving for the holidays, we request that you turn off all lights, electrical appliances and window air conditioners in your rooms, offices, and laboratories," he said. "During this operation our resources will be taxed to the maximum, striving to provide power for your minimum essential use. To make this possible we must have the cooperation of all University personnel in refraining from using any unnecessary electrical power in the University facilities on Nov. 26 and 27. Building and Utilities personnel will turn off all building air conditioning systems and restore their operation after the outage," Budget said. The power will not be interrupted to facilities west of the rail-

roads, Hensel, College View or project house apartments. The Thanksgiving holiday period has been selected for the power interruption in order to inconvenience University operations as little as possible. All electric power will be off in the following buildings from 6 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. Thanksgiving Day: Dorms 1 through 12, Duncan Mess Hall, A&M Creamery, Agriculture Building, Agricultural Information, Animal Husbandry Pavilion, Animal Industries Building, Bolton Hall, Data Processing Center, Fernier Hall, golf course club house, Herman Heep Building, Nagle Hall, Plant Sciences, Soil & Crop Sciences, State Chemist (Analytical Laboratory), System Administration Building.

The electric power is to be off in the following buildings from 6 a.m. on Thanksgiving Day until Nov. 28: Academic, Architecture, Biological Sciences, Bizzell, Chemistry, Coliseum, Deware Field House, Downs Natatorium, Francis Hall, Goodwin Hall, Guion Hall, Military Sciences, Petroleum Engineering, Physics and the Woodford Cain Swimming Pool.

Deer season will open in Brazos County Saturday and will close at dusk Dec. 31, said Jack Woodford, District Chief of the Forestry and Wildlife Department of Brazos County. Hunters must have a license which will have three tags on the bottom to be attached to the deer he kills, Woodford said.

Each hunter is allowed three deer. However, only two of these can be bucks, Woodford explained. In order to kill a doe or an antlerless buck, hunters must receive a doe permit from the owner of the lease where they are hunting. If the hunter obtains three doe permits, he can kill three does or antlerless bucks.

Hunters should remember that although it is legal to use a .22 rifle, it is illegal to use a rimfire cartridge in the rifle, but centerfire cartridges are legal. Woodford said Thursday that the population of White Tail deer was average in the county this year and urged hunters to use safety precautions.
