

Chemical Engineers Return From Industry Field Trip

A&M University senior students in chemical engineering return to the campus late Wednesday after a three-day inspection trip of the chemical and allied industries along the upper Gulf coast.

The group of approximately 40 students accompanied by Dr. R. R. Davison, professor of chemical engineering, and Dr. C. D. Holland, head of the department, visited plants in the area from Orange to Pasadena. The plants process Texas' natural resources into organic chemicals, plastics synthetic rubber, anti-freeze material and many products of petroleum oil.

Texas A&M University students in listing religious preferences name more than a dozen branches of the Christian faith, plus the Buddhist, Jewish and Moslem faiths. The survey was released by J. Gordon Gay, coordinator of religious life and YMCA general secretary.

The denominational preferences list showed 1,804 Texas Aggies named the Baptist Church, 1,623 the Methodist and 1,372 listed the Roman Catholic Church.

More than 1,300 students gave no preference.

The survey reflected other denominational preferences by more than 75 students: Presbyterian, 588; Episcopal, 392; Lutheran, 365; Church of Christ, 352; and Christian (Disciples of Christ), 190.

Among the other preferences were 63 Jewish, 20 Moslem and 4 Buddhist.

A&M University hosted 2,277 visitors during November, according to an estimate by P. L. Downs Jr., official greeter for the university.

Downs said the visitors were attending short courses, conferences, class reunions, and other scheduled meetings. Nineteen groups made up the total.

A&M University will hold its 19th annual Turfgrass Conference Dec. 7-9.

Dr. E. C. Holt, agronomy professor and program chairman, said the meeting features the latest research findings and methods for managers of parks, golf courses, cemeteries and other turf areas.

Bill Jackson of the Department of Agricultural Education will speak on "Judging Quarter Horses" to the Alamo District vocational agriculture teachers at 4:30 p.m. Dec. 9 in Converse.

W. H. Pittard, Jr., of Austin, Area 7 supervisor of vocational agriculture, said the meeting is a part of an in-service educational program planned by district teachers.

Homeowners Making Plans To Winterize For Comfort

With cooler weather already here and more just around the corner, many homeowners are making plans to winterize their homes for increased winter comfort and economy.

A good place to start this job is with the doors and windows, advises W. S. Allen, Extension agricultural engineer. Many windows and doors fit loosely but can be tightened easily with weather stripping.

Storm sashes can be helpful in reducing heat loss from the house. In northern areas, addition of storm windows, doors and weather stripping can reduce the fuel bill considerably.

Proper insulation in the unheated attic will also cut fuel bills, says Allen. Place the insulation between the attic floor joists to help reduce heat loss from the rooms below. With this insulation, however, there should

be ventilation in the attic. Vents placed in the gable ends of the house, under the eaves or installed in the roof will be adequate. The engineer suggests about four square feet of clear openings for each 1,000 square feet of attic floor.

Storm doors, storm windows and attic insulation not only cut heat loss and save fuel but also reduce drafts. This means a more uniform heating system throughout the house, points out Allen. Next summer the insulation in the attic will help keep the house cooler, too.
