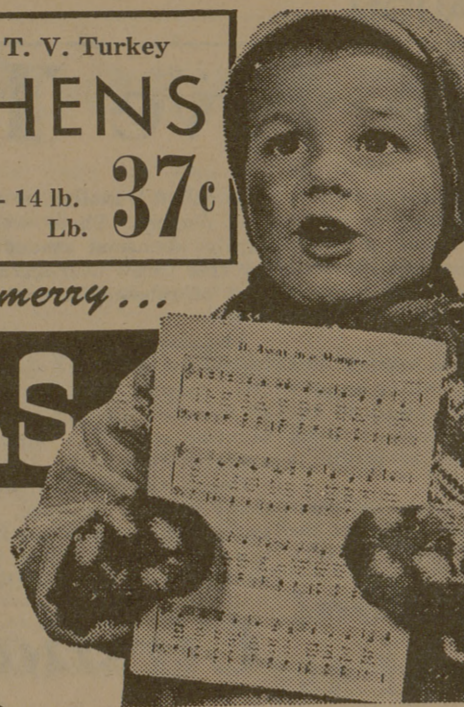

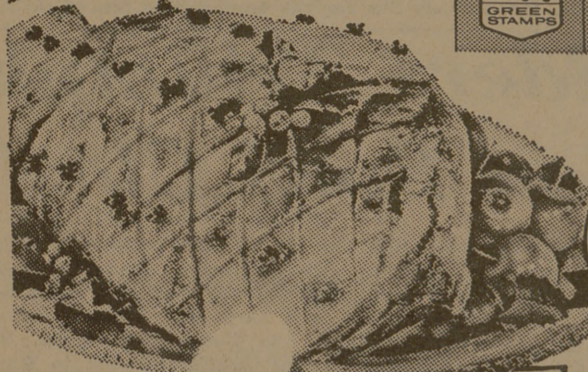

FROM THE
Sidelines

The first press conference held by new A&M football coach Gene Stallings was a lively and revealing event. The major paper in the state sent at least one correspondent to cover the proceedings.

As the discussion wore on, the personality of the Aggie topkick began to show through. The 29-year-old East Texas native was relaxed, friendly and self-assured.

Many veteran sports writers compared his deep, drawn-out voice with that of Bear Bryant, his former coach and mentor. His lanky but solid build was even reminiscent of the Bear's frame.

Several impressions particularly stand out from the conference. The sincerity of the former Aggie football captain is perhaps the strongest. His fondness for A&M is genuine. So is his confidence that the Cadets are on the way back to football.

Another impression gleaned from the confab is that Stallings and his staff are going to be an aggressive, hard-working group. Stallings and three of the four assistants he has named are all under thirty.

Several times he was asked about incidents that occurred during his playing days here. He recalled that during Bryant's first spring training the squad worked out at night.

"After the workouts we used to eat and then go out to Guion to watch a movie."

That memory strikes pretty close to home. So does the vaguely familiar ring that he wears on his left hand.

A brief reminder that Shelby Metcalf's potent offense will entertain surprising Baylor the first Tuesday after the holidays. The Bears have cracked the century scoring mark in three games thus far. Against Trinity they smashed an all-time SWC scoring mark with 139 points.

The Cadets have triumphed in six of seven starts this season and appear headed for another good season. The cast of characters is the same, this year's team noticeably different edition from last year.

This is a run-and-shoot ball club, one averaging 80 points a game. It features a headier offense and an aggressive, pressing defense.

Center John Beasley has inherited the conference scoring suzerainty owned the last four seasons by Aggies Cliff Broussard and Bennie Lenox. The Kildare product has been firing at a 24-points-per-game clip with a season high of 40 against Southern Mississippi.

It's still too early to determine the real strength of the team. Their schedule has been varied but not overly taxing. As was the case last year, the Cadets seem to be improving with experience.

They try Houston again tonight and have a December date with Trinity in San Antonio. Drive carefully to the games and have a nice holiday.
