

Bill Hancock Named Top College Athlete

Bill Hancock, former three time All-Southwest Conference Aggie catcher, has been named Ark-La-Tex College Athlete of the Year by the Shreveport Journal.

During the 1964 season he batted .299 for the Ags and led the conference in runs batted in. He was also named to the College All-American team.

Hancock first came to A&M as a third baseman. He batted .260 his freshman year and sparked the Fish to a SWC championship. He led the loop in batting with .447 as a sophomore.

As a junior he batted .325 and won the league home run crown. He switched to catcher his senior year.

The honoree was the first A&M athlete to be awarded the Wally Moon Trophy, taking the award his sophomore year a the most improved athlete on the College Station campus.

Hancock said his biggest baseball thrill came when the Aggies clinched the SWC championship by downing Texas last spring.

Maroon Gunners Shellshock Owls

 It just didn't seem fair, what those Aggie cagers did to Rice last Saturday night, and Coach Shelby Metcalf must have sensed it as he emptied his bench onto Autry Court in the Rice Fieldhouse. But he started too late.

The momentum gained by starters Sonny Fethkenher, Ken Norman, John Beasley, Paul Timmins and Dickie Stringfellow was not to be thrown to the winds and the Ags went on to win, 93-55.

A bunch of 'scrappy subs kept the injury-ridden Owls at bay until the final horn sounded. A lot of the 4,200 in the crowd figured out pretty early that this was not to be Rice's night and exited after the band had performed their Latin tempo half-time show.

In all of the comings and goings on the court, it would take a rare man to keep his head or his temper. The referees proved the former, calling 56 fouls, 28 on both teams. Two Rice players were the latter, feeling that they were pushed, elbowed or bumped one too many times, and decided it was time to push back. It ended as soon as it started.

Rice's showing against A&M in the Bluebonnet Bowl Tournament, plus their victory over Baylor and near defeat of SWC co-leader SMU must have instilled some hope in the hearts of some of the Blue and Grey's supporters as Saturday's crowd was the largest of the season.

No doubt could have been in their minds after the tipoff as

the Aggies went ahead, were at 2-2, were tied at 5-5 and disappeared from the Owls' sight.

Coach George Carlisle was in any mood for jokes following his team's 12th loss in 13 starts. "We just got the daylight knocked out of us — every way in the world. The story of how they got their big lead was on the boards.

"At the half," Carlisle recalled, "they had 16 fields goals and of them came on their second, third and fourth shots. They led us rebounding."

Beasley collected 13 of his team's 53 rebounds which is 13 more than the Rice Owls could get all night.

"Here they go again. Just last year," muttered a photographer for a Houston paper, "he packed his gear and left the court to make his paper's deadline.

The team and Shelby Metcalf hope so too.

 The Fish cagers won their second straight game to even the season record at 3-3 at the expense of the Rice Owls in a prelim Saturday night.

Center Larry Ditto, who left from Breckenridge, sparked the Fish with 21 points and was one of five Aggies in double figures.

Forwards Terry Trippett and Max Mainord scored 19 and 18 points, while Guards Kent Andrews and Jimmy Lennox each scored 12 in A&M's second conference win.
