Of course, not all honor violations are taken to the council. Major violations such as theft or bribery are often referred to the Campus Security office for decisive action and dismissal. 

LONDON-Prime Minister Harold Wilson has ostponed a visit to Washington. Sources said he wants more time to woo the West Germans on nuclear strategy before seeing President Johnson. * * *

TOKYO-About 7,300 persons demonstrated in the southern port city of Sasebo Wednesday against the second visit of an American nuclear submarine. It was the largest demonstration since the Navy's Sea Dragon arrived Tuesday at Sasebo. But police reported no disturbances.

National VANDENBERG AIR FORCE BASE, Calif.-A ripple launch" sent two Minuteman intercontinental ballistic missiles speeding toward a target area in the Pacific within minutes of each other, the Air
