The first Heavy Duty Rescue Training Course of 1965 is scheduled for Feb. 22-27, Henry D. Smith, chief of Firemen's Training for the Engineering Extension Service, has announced.

The school is a division of the Firemen's Training School, sponsored by the State Firemen's and Fire Marshal's Association in cooperation with the Texas Department of Public Safety and the Office of Defense and Disaster Relief.

Sepcial emphasis is placed on advanced rescue work and rescue team operations. Students who complete the five and one-half day course are qualified to use highly specialized equipment and special techniques for working at extreme heights and depths in the rescue of trapped victims.

Enrollees work with rescue trucks and equipment under guidance of experts in rescue operations. Facilities include the recently constructed disaster street at the training school campus near Easterwood Airport. The street contains buildings in various stages of destruction. Students practice rescuing victims in all sorts of disaster situations.


