Miss Ohr admits she had "qualms" about enrolling at A&M but decided to try it anyway because of the quality of the computer science program.

"I was afraid the all-male staff at the center would resent my intrusion of their private domain but this wasn't the case at all. They went out of their way to show me the ropes and to help me learn computer operations," she said.

The third and final presentation of the "Faith and Life Series" for this academic year will be presented under the auspices of Campus Religious Workers' Association, Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the All Faiths Chapel.

The program will feature Dr. Gustave A. Ferre, chairman of the Department of Philosophy at TCU. He will be speaking on the topic of God as creator under the title "Maker of Heaven and Earth."

Ferre comes from a noted theological family.

Ferre has spoken on many campuses, written for various professional periodicals, and authored two books, "A Layman Examines His Faith" and "Basic Philosophical Issues." He was educated at Boston University (AB), Andover Newton Theological School (BD), Yale Divinity School, and Vanderbilt University (Ph.D.).

He has taught at Vanderbilt U.; Cotner School of Religion, University of Nebraska; and Texas Christian University.

All students are encouraged to attend. Also, all faculty, staff of the university, and all interested people of the community are cordially invited and encouraged to attend this concluding presentation.

The previous two presentations in the "Faith and Life Series" were a panel of local political personages on the topic, "Ethics of Politics" and the "Bishop's Company's" presentation of Ibsen's drama, "An Enemy of the People." Army Cites Aggie-Ex For Preventing Drownings

A 1964 graduate of A&M, John W. Henley of San Angelo has been cited for heroism by the United States Army.

First Lt. Henley, officer in charge of the U. S. Army Veterinary Food Inspection Detachment in Sacramento, Calif., received a certificate of achievement for rescuing two men from Folsom Lake in California.

While boating on Folsom Lake Oct. 16, 1964, Lt. Henley noticed a capsized boat and two men in the water. He rescued them after both had sunk beneath the surface. With the help of a companion, Henley applied artificial respiration for an hour until an ambulance arrived to take the men to a hospital.

Lt. Henley is also a graduate of the U. S. Army Medical Service School in Chicago, Ill.
