

# Aggie Seniors Bow Out Tonight In Lubbock

Three seniors will suit up for the last time in an Aggie uniform Thursday night when the Cadet cagers close out the season in Lubbock against Texas Tech.

Captain Paul Timmins and forwards Bill Gasway and Ken Norman are the performers bow-

ing out against the Red Raiders. All three will be in the starting line-up, as they were last season when the Aggies captured the Southwest Conference championship.

Going into the Tech tilt, Timmins is carrying a 12-point av-

erage while Norman is averaging 13. Gasway is hitting close to six points a game and is the club's second-leading rebounder behind junior center John Beasley.

Beasley is the most prolific Aggie scorer ever. He is firing at over a 27-per-game clip in league play and is averaging over 25 for the full season. The Kildare product now holds every A&M individual scoring mark for a single game and for a season's output. He also holds the school rebounding record for a single season.

The Lubbock tilt is mean-

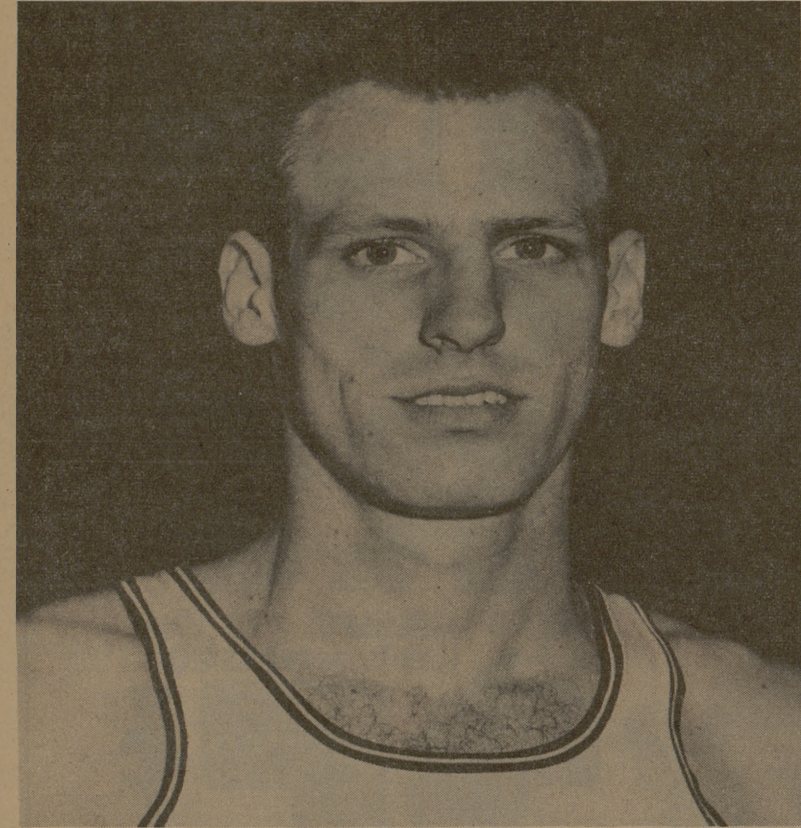

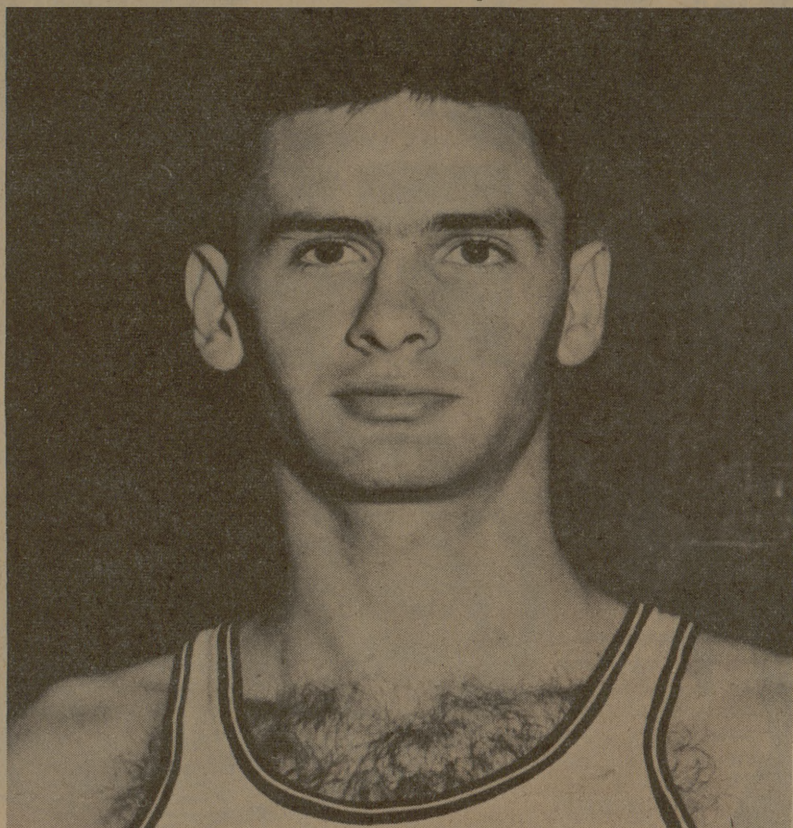

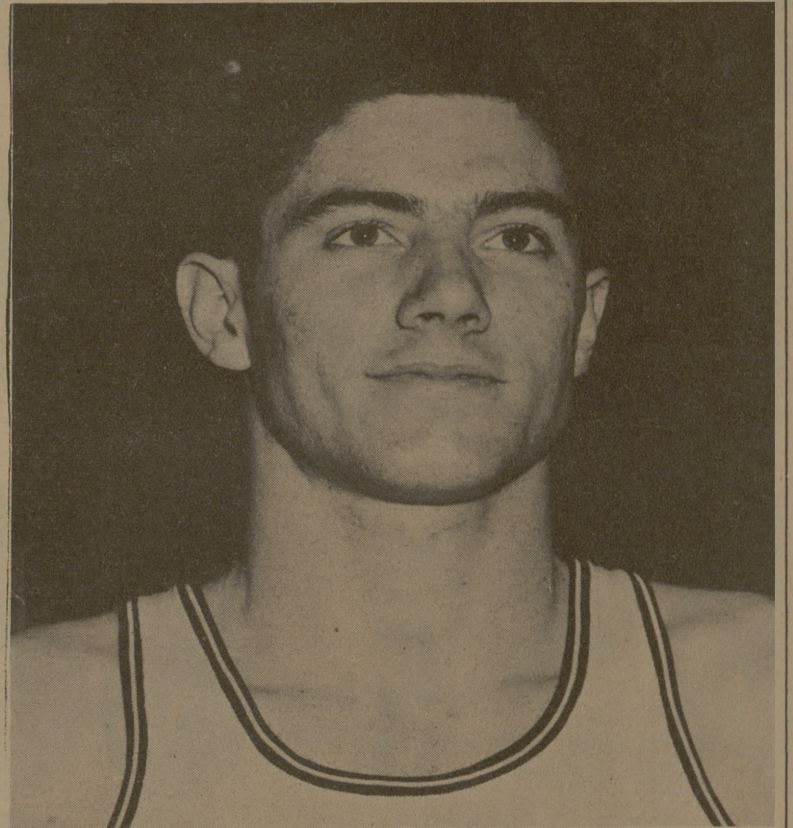
Tipoff time for the season finale is 8 p.m. The contest will unfold in Lubbock's Municipal Coliseum, which holds over 10,000.

## Bradley's Departure Allows Princeton A Return To Normal

PRINCETON, N. J. (AP)—Princeton goes back to playing basketball next year and the game and Coach Bill van Breda Kolff can assume their real names.

For the past three seasons, campus wits have been chortling that Princeton really was playing Bradleyball under Coach van Bradley Kolff.

The reason for the puns is Bill Bradley, Olympic star, Rhodes Scholar and two-time All-America who climaxed a brilliant career Wednesday when he was named college Player of the Year by The Associated Press.

The 6-foot-5 Bradley, a native of Crystal City, Mo., won the honor by a 116-30 vote over Cazzie Russell of Michigan in balloting by 216 sports writers and broadcasters.

"He's something; he really is," van Breda Kolff said. "And I appreciate him more this year. I always had the semi-feeling that much of what he accomplished was the result of his hard work and incessant practice. But this year his native ability has come out."

The change in the handsome, dark-haired Bradley has been noticeable off the court, too.

After leading Princeton to three straight Ivy League championships and packing arenas wherever he

played, Bradley is foregoing pro ball to accept a Rhodes Scholarship for two years of study at England's Oxford University.

## Kruse Hits 54 For Kilgore Cagers

JACKSONVILLE (AP)—Don Kruse scored 54 points Wednesday night as Kilgore downed Lon Morris 86-78 and took the Region 14 North Zone junior college basketball championship.

The victory was the 26th straight for Kilgore, which will

face the south zone winner in a game which will decide a place in the national junior college tournament.

Kruse's scoring spree set a tournament record. He was named the tournament's outstanding player.

## Prep Cagers Begin State Tourney Play

AUSTIN (AP)—Some old cagers, some who have never had a good chance, will bid for five state titles at the 45th annual schoolboy basketball tournament opening Thursday.

Snook, high-scoring and strong on defense, meets Krum in the first game of the three-day tournament. Snook, owning a fabulous 47-1 record, is top-heavy favorite to win the Class B title.

The favorites in the other classes are West Sabine (Class A); Phillips, A&A; San Marcos, AAA, and Houston Jones (AAAA).

The Tigers won the first state championship tournament one by a forfeit—in 1921 and 1922—and have gained the playoffs times. This year El Paso is in and survived a strong regional Midland Lee and Pampa—to reach the tournament. The Tigers' final opponent Friday afternoon is potent Dallas Jefferson, 33-1, 1962 champion.

Jones, 35-3, and Kingsville, 22-1, play Friday night in the other semifinals in AAAA.

San Marcos, 23-5 and last year's state finalist football team, is the nod in AAA with the best scoring average and second-best defensive mark of the four tries. San Marcos, a 1940 winner and West Orange, 20-10, on Thursday night, followed by W. ahachie 28-4 and Brownwood 22-4.

In AA, Phillips will try to prove offense is the most important phase of the game. The Blue Hawks, 29-4, have the finest scoring average of any team in the tournament, 77.7 points a game but have given up 61.2, the worst defensive record. Phillips played Port Acres, 18-7, Thursday afternoon, and Lake Worth, 26-8, at Randolph Air Force Base, 22-10, are the other semi-finalists.
