NSF Renews Co-Op Grant

The National Science Foundation has notified President Earl Rudder of a one-year renewal and additional grant of \$25,000 for an A&M-Argentine cooperative project in oceanography. The new grant raises the total to more than \$72,000 for the study entering its third year.

Dr. Dale F. Leipper of the oceanography faculty and Argentine Capt. Luis Capurro of that nation's hydrographic office are the principal investigators.

The study of "Surface and Deep Current Measurements in the Drake Passage' now has been extended to include waters of the southern ocean around Antarctica beyond Argentina.

Direct current measurements are taken through the use of buoys and floats, Leipper said. Captain Capurro directs the cruises.

A biological study of the same waters also is underway with A&M and Argentine scientists cooperathing. The NSF also sponsors
