Aggie Grid Battle Set For Saturday

Coach Gene Stallings' first Aggie football team will make their spring debut in Kyle Field Saturday night before what is expected to be one of the largest crowds ever to witness a spring game in the Southwest Conference.

The annual Maroon - White game will kickoff at 7:30 p.m. in front of about 15-20,000 fans. The Bryan-College Station Aggie Quarterback Club, the local Jaycees, the Former Students Association and the Aggie Club have combined the past few weeks in an attempt to attract a large crowd.

The 1964-65 Aggie Band will march into Kyle Field and will play from the stands in one of their closing appearances of the year. After the game Saturday night, they will play only for the Mother's Day review and Final Review. Half-time entertainment will be furnished by the famed Kilgore Junior College Rangereettes.

Also at halftime, the recruits for the 1965 Fish football squad will be introduced.

The new football motto is "Make Something Happen," instead of waiting for something to happen. Stallings and his aides have been working during

spring training to instill this mental attitude in the Aggies. The 73-varsity squad will be divided into Maroon and White units of near equal potential. The young, inexperienced team has only 12 seniors on the varsity, including eight two-year lettermen.

The Aggies are preparing for the platoon system allowed by next year's rules.

Ags Tackle Bears

The Texas A&M baseball team travels to Waco Friday for a crucial two-day series with the Baylor Bears.

The first game is at 3 p.m. Friday, with the second tilt set for 2 p.m. Saturday. The series is do-or die for both teams in the Southwest Conference championship running.

Coach Tom Chandler said, "We need both of them very badly, and Baylor has a fine team." He said the Aggie "have come along real good since the first of the year."

Chandler said he was going to start Tommy Chiles on the mound Friday and Steve Hillhouse Saturday. Baylor is expected to pit Rod Robinson against Chiles.

Ralph Beckner will handle the catching chores for the Maroon and Billy Crain will start at first base.
