LIBRARY REGULATIONS

Books are ordinarily charged out for two weeks at a time, with the privilege of one renewal. Books with waiting lists are not subject to the renewal privilege. All books must be brought in to be renewed.

Books that are overdue may not be renewed until the fine has been paid. I. D. Cards must be presented by all University Students for all books to be charged out. Reserve books are to be used for not more than two hours, and are not to be taken from the library except when charged out overnight at the Reserve Desk on the first floor. These books may be charged out one hour before closing, and they must be returned within one hour after opening the next day.

For infraction of rules, fines are charged as follows: For overdue books, regularly charged out, 10 cents a day per book. This rate will continue for 15 days; if the book has not been returned within that time, the patron will be charged the full price of the book.

Any publication in the library needed by faculty members for constant reference may, at the discretion of the librarian, be taken out for the term, subject to recall in case of demand. Bound and unbound periodicals, however, are restricted to a one week charge for faculty and overnight charge for graduate students, and may not be renewed. 187t2

Coyotes Given Blame For Wolf Scare In Local Area

Recent wolf reports coming out of Brazos County and East Texas have a major flaw: The animals seen, trapped or shot at are mostly large, well-fed coyotes.

Either way, the situation is worrying farmers and ranchers. The varmints are becoming more numerous, bolder and wiser.

Wolf stories usually refer to the red wolf, but several observers at Texas A&M believe that genuine specimens are scarce. Dr. W. B. Davis, head of the Wildlife Management Department, is one of those skeptics.

"In my book, the true red wolf is rare in this region. I've run across very few specimens that are the real thing. On the other hand, I've seen plenty of specimens which are nothing more than big coyotes," Davis said.

He said it is easy to confuse the two out in the wilds, especially in East Texas. The largest coyotes live in the Rocky Mountains and the second in size run right here in this part of Texas. So, many folks are convinced they are seeing wolves.

For wildlife buffs, the genus and species name for the red wolf is *Canis niger*. And niger, by the

way, means black, not red. The coyote is *Canis latrans*, of which there are about four sub-species in Texas. Its range extends from Alaska to Central America.

The biggest is *Canis lupus*, otherwise known as gray wolf, timber wolf or lobo of Yukon tall tale fame. It ranges from Mexico to Alaska.

One thing for sure, Davis says color is no more accurate in identification than to say that all blonds are Scandinavians. Hair coat on wolves and coyotes runs from black to almost white.

Identification is further complicated by crossbreeding with dogs.

Davis added that the true red wolf has a nose pad 1 1/4 to 2 inches wide, and the distance from the tip of the foot to the first joint on the hind feet is at least 8 1/2 inches. The same measurements on the coyotes are smaller.

Coyotes run with the tail down. Wolves hold theirs straight out.

He said coyotes will eat almost anything, from livestock to a prickly pear salad. Rodents and rabbits are their main fare, however.

A survey of contents of 8,000

coyote stomachs from the eastern U. S. showed 33 percent bit, 25 percent carrion, 1 percent rodents and 2 percent tentative matter among many items. Only 13 percent were posed of livestock.

"Looking at coyotes that you could say they are coyotes," Davis said.

Why are "wolves" on the increase in Brazos County and surrounding areas?

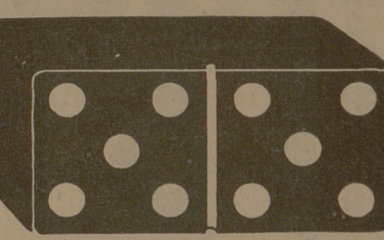
Davis believes that the varmints are smart and sly enough to adapt to man's pressure on deer, rats and rabbits.

Finally, cultivated brushy areas are increasing, providing more cover and shelter for coyotes.

James E. Poore, assistant trict agent with the Texas Department of Game and Fish, agrees with Davis on coyote confusion.

Most of the animals around here are big red wolves. Some definite breeding with dogs.
