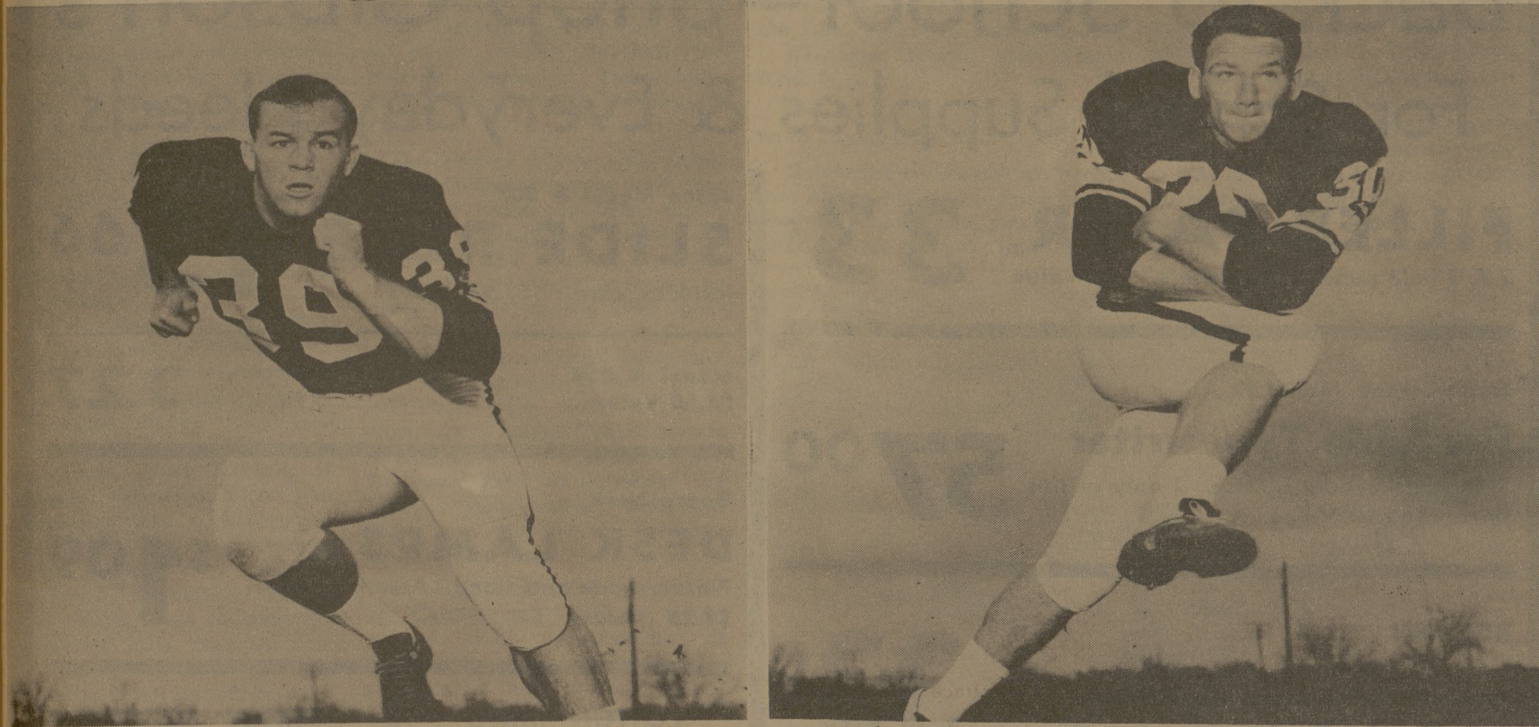


# To Tame Tigers... Defense! Offense!

## A&M Consolidated Tackles Caldwell Friday Night

A&M Consolidated's Tigers have been mending their ways as well as their injuries this past week after receiving a 28-7 pasting from Beaumont's Forest Park.  
Head Coach Edsel Jones' Bengals will be shy of four starters in this week's contest with Caldwell. The Tigers will host the Hornets on Bryan's Bronco Field this Friday. Consolidated's new

bleachers are not completely installed.  
Fullback Paul Becker and back Fred Davis are both doubtful starters. They are sidelined with recurring knee injuries. Duke Miller, 10-AAA all-district end in 1964, is suffering from two bum shoulders and has added a bad thumb to his miseries this week in practice. Willie Edmonds has been in the hospital, but it is not determined whether or not his problem resulted from a football injury.  
Sophomore David Terrell will be back in the lineup at full speed this week. The fleet back saw limited action in last Friday's game at split end.  
The Tiger mentor plans several moves to fill the vacancies caused by injuries. Jimbo Robison will start at the man-under spot with Paul Fagan moving from tailback to fullback to replace Becker. Steve Boring will

DALLAS — Talent and apparently an ability to keep the faith have established the University of Texas as the favorite to win the Southwest Conference Football championship. At least that is the composite opinion of 19 sports writers and sportscasters who have completed the annual 2,000-mile tour of all eight Conference training camps.  
Texas, Arkansas and Baylor were selected to finish 1-2-3, with each of them receiving championship consideration. Texas received 13 votes for first place, one ballot to share the title with Arkansas and no placing below runner-up. Arkansas was the championship choice of four and co-champion by one, while Baylor received the only other nomination for the pennant. None other was picked higher than third.

In order, behind those three, the consensus selection named Texas Tech, SMU, Rice, TCU and A&M.  
Texas was the only choice of the past four seasons to emerge with the championship that had been accorded. This was in the 1962 season, when the experts' 1-2-3 selection conformed, and Texas has the distinction of only once finishing lower than predicted.  
Arkansas disappointed only in 1963, when picked to win, while Baylor has fallen below expectations only once. Baylor won the show position by a thin margin over Tech this year, while Rice got the nod over TCU for sixth place by an even thinner edge.  
The writers acknowledged that Arkansas might have been the choice a week earlier. Uncertainty at quarterback during the past week probably cost the Razorbacks a nomination to repeat as champions.

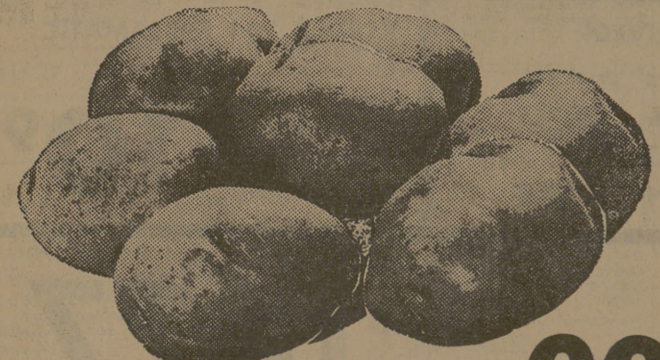

**BLACKIE SHERROD**, Dallas Times-Herald: 1-Texas; 2-Arkansas; 3-Baylor; 4-5 tie between Tech and SMU; 6-Rice; 7-8 tie between A&M and TCU. (Biggest thing against Arkansas is 11-0 record; Texas more accustomed to following success with success.)  
**JOE HELING**, Austin Statesman: 1-Texas (Arkansas had a great year... now it's Texas' turn... Arkansas has QB and defensive troubles, while Texas has solid look and Tommy Nobis); 2-Arkansas; 3-Tech; 4-Baylor; 5-SMU; 6-Rice; 7-TCU; 8-A&M.  
**FRED SANNER**, Austin American: 1-Texas; 2-Baylor; 3-Arkansas (threat to win if defensive secondary develops); 4-Tech; 5-SMU (could be surprise of year); 6-Rice; 7-TCU; 8-A&M.  
**JIM BROWDER**, Fort Worth Press: 1-Texas; 2-Arkansas; 3-4 Tech and Baylor tie; 5-SMU; 6-TCU; 7-Rice; 8-A&M. (Two-team fight; Arkansas hard hit by loss of leadership, talent.)  
**FRANK BOGGS**, Dallas Times-Herald: 1-Texas; 2-3 tie between Baylor and Arkansas; 4-Tech; 5-Rice; 6-SMU; 7-TCU; 8-A&M. (If Texas goes unbeaten in the Conference — and this should

be the year nobody does—Longhorns will win by two games; Baylor to beat Arkansas in first shocker).

**DAVE CAMPBELL**, Waco Tribune-Herald: 1-Texas (The most of the best and fewer problems at critical positions); 2-Arkansas; 3-Baylor; 4-SMU; 5-Tech; 6-TCU; 7-8 tie between A&M and Rice.  
**SAM BLAIR**, Dallas News: 1-Texas (Royal says Longhorns are thin. Everyone should be on their diet); 2-Arkansas; 3-SMU; 4-Tech; 5-TCU; 6-Baylor; 7-A&M; 8-Rice.  
**BILL VAN FLEET**, Ft. Worth Star-Telegram: 1-Texas; 2-Arkansas; 3-Baylor; 4-Tech; 5-A&M; 6-TCU; 7-Rice; 8-A&M. (Texas wins it with more good athletes. Pressure of unbeaten string will be too big of a burden for Porkers.)

**SAM PAYNE**, Amarillo Globe-News: 1-Texas; 2-Arkansas; 3-Tech; 4-Baylor; 5-SMU; 6-Rice; 7-A&M; 8-TCU. (QB situation and inexperienced secondary steered me from Arkansas; SMU is darkhorse.)  
**ROY EDWARDS**, Dallas News: 1-Texas (has best operator and best defender); 2-Arkansas (lots of horses but will lose the big game); 3-Tech (lacks only winning tradition); 4-SMU (Mac White will bring new life); 5-Baylor (too young, too thin); 6-TCU; 7-A&M; 8-Rice.  
**CHARLES CARDER**, Houston Chronicle: 1-2 tie between Texas and Arkansas (they've dominated SWC for six years and no reason to see why there'll be a change); 3-Tech; 4-Baylor; 5-SMU; 6-Rice; 7-8 tie between TCU and A&M.

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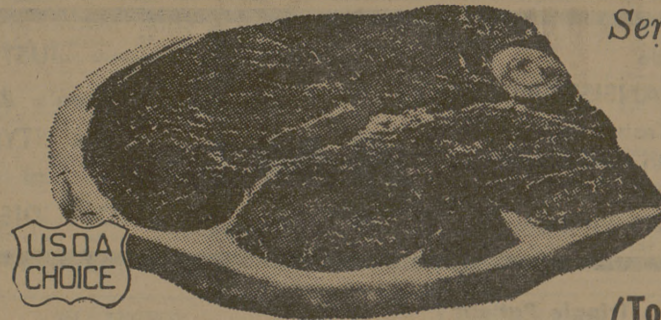
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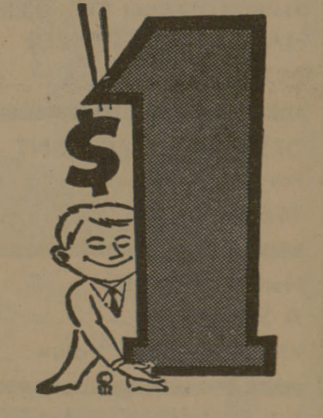
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
