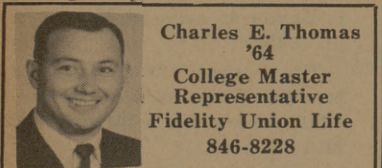
Nelson, of Morton Foods in Dallas, will speak on "Matitutions and Communications." The dinner will cost \$2.50 per person.

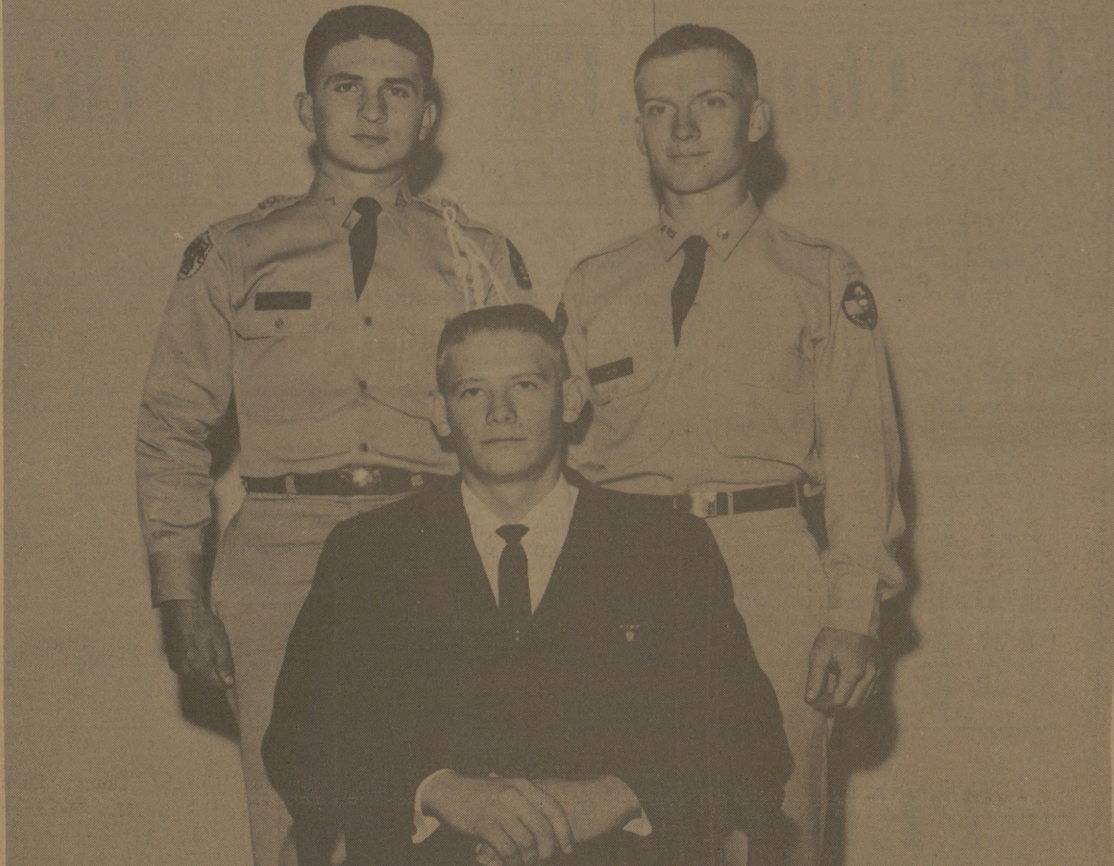
17 Students Enroll In Acting Course

Bryan To Open Education Program

"Operation Opportunity," Bryan Public School System's new adult education program, is slated to get under way Nov. 1. "This program is being established to provide an opportunity for those adults who feel that they could benefit from increased education," said A. R. Denney, program director. Those who choose to enroll in the program will be assigned to classes according to their educational needs.

Grades one through three will be covered in the primary level of the program, the fourth through the sixth in the intermediate level and the seventh and eighth in the advanced level. Each level will consist of 120 hours of night time instruction which will be broken up into 2 two-hour meetings each week for 30 weeks.
