Something didn't happen.
The Aggies' passes didn't hit,
their tackles were only made after
five yard gains, pass protection
was nonexistant, and 99 yards
total offense just isn't enough
to win a ball game. Especially
when the opposition rolls up 476
yards, including 286 in the air
by a third-string quarterback.
The deepest penetration the
Aggies could muster was in the
fourth quarter when they charged
to the Baylor 19. TThe offensive
weapon used in this drive was
the habitual use of the red flag
by officials that moved the Cadets
45 yards in five "plays." What
looked like an Aggie threat was
squelched by the second most
unbelievable play of the day.
Harry Ledbetter threw the
bomb, but it was intercepted.
The alert Bear ran around the
