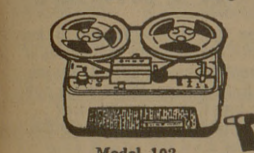

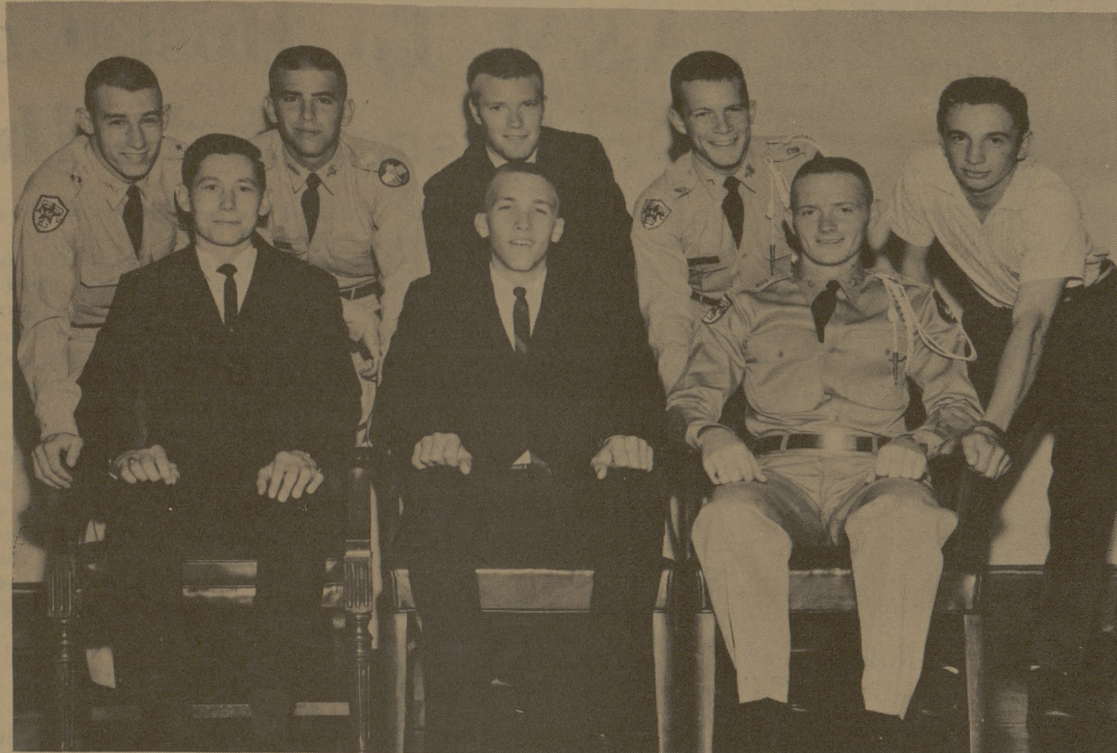

**Agricultural Briefs**

**Five Research Grants Given To Ag Experiment Station**

Five grants for \$14,382 have been made available to the Agricultural Experiment Station, Dr. R. E. Patterson, station director, has announced. Largest of the grants of \$6,900 from Hoffman-Taff, Inc., of Springfield, Mo., to support studies on effects of feed additives in growing rations for laying chickens and turkeys. Plains Cotton Growers, Inc., of

Lubbock has provided \$3,282 for boll weevil research work. A \$2,489 grant is from the Herman Frasch Foundation of New York for work on chemistry of poisonous range plants. Hercules Powder Company has made \$1,471 available for installation of a bi-fluid system on an airplane for research on aerial application of oil emulsion sprays.

P. T. Poultry Growers of Center has provided a \$240 grant to support research at the East Texas Poultry Disease Investigations Laboratory at Center. Maria project with Abdelmajid Gara, director of the Tunisia Agricultural Education Department, and with the American staff in Chott Maria. Chott Maria Agricultural College is a land grant type of school near Sousse, Tunisia. The visitor will talk also to a group of future trainees scheduled to register as freshmen next January at Texas A&M.

The students will comprise the fourth group of Tunisians to participate in the United States Agency for International Development program at A&M.

**University Women Set Grad Awards**

Application forms are available for the competitive American Association of University Women Fellowships from the local chapter headquarters.

In 1966-67 there will be 53 fellowships available to American women for doctoral or post-doctoral study. The applications deadline is Dec. 1.

There are three groupings of AAUW fellowships. The "Fellowships for American Women" consist of 50 fellowships from \$3,000 to \$5,000 that are open to women who are U. S. citizens and are unrestricted as to age, place of research and subject. Awards are not made in the creative or performing arts. Applicants must hold the doctorate or equivalent or must have fulfilled all doctoral requirements except the dissertation.

The three "Fellowships in the Natural Sciences" consists of the following post-doctoral stipends of \$5,000. The Marie Curie Fellowship in radiology, physics, or chemistry, is open to women of

France or the U.S.A. The Sarah Berliner Fellowship is open to women of any country for study in physics, chemistry, or biology. The Ida H. Hyde Fellowship in ethnics or eugenics is open to all women.

There are also a large number of AAUW "International Fellowships" which are open to women of any country other than the U. S., for graduate study or research in the U. S.

At present the AAUW has 19 endowed international fellowships and about 40 unendowed international fellowships per year. Applicants must possess English fluency, B.A. degree or equivalent, a good plan of study or research which has social significance, and the intention to return to her own country to provide constructive leadership. The deadline for these completed application is also Dec. 1, 1965.

Mrs. W. L. Russell noted that the AAUW Fellowships Program began back in 1888 with a modest award of \$350. It has grown steadily and since 1927, the total

expenditure on stipends is \$5,910,000.
