ball and ping pong.

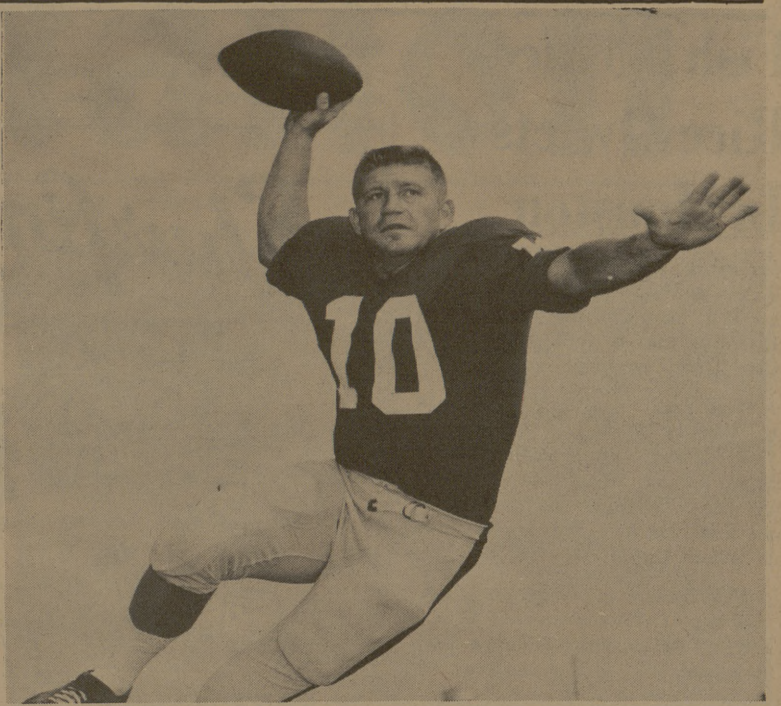
Class B horseshoes reached the
