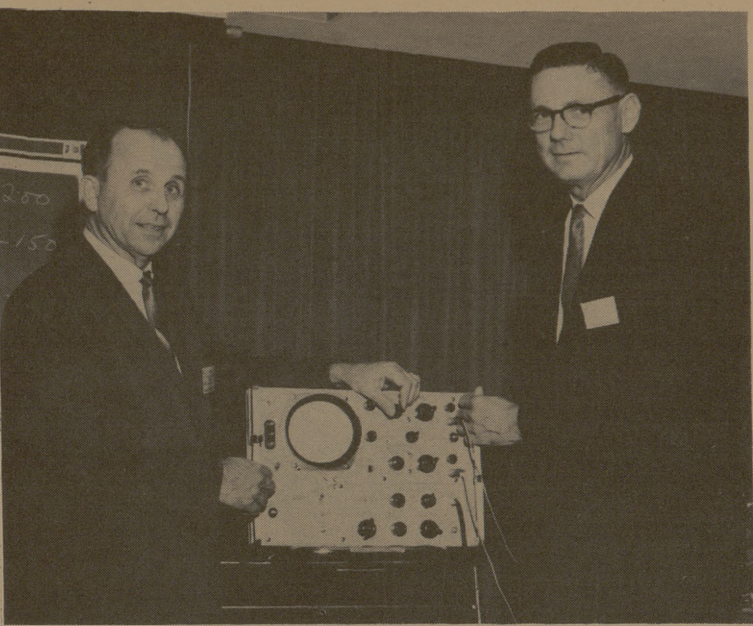

Smith Featured Speaker At Mexican Safety Meeting

Henry D. Smith, chief of the Fireman's Training Division of the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, will be a featured speaker during Mexico's National Safety Congress Nov. 20-26.

Smith will discuss "Benefits of Firefighting Training" Thangsgiving Day at Mexico City's Continental Hilton Hotel. The congress is comparable to the national firemen's convention in the

United States.

Smith is a member of fire protection and mutual aid panels for municipal and industrial organizations.

Following the congress, Smith and his wife will be guests of the Mexican government for a tour of Central Mexico, including Acapulco and Guadalajara.

The Smiths will be accompanied to Mexico by Luling Fire Chief and Mrs. Paul B. Conley.

TTI Gets \$357,000 Grant For Breakaway Road Signs

The Texas Transportation Institute will conduct a \$367,600 study of breakaway signs for highway signs, lights and utilities, the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads has announced.

Fred J. Benson, dean of the College of Engineering, said the study will begin Dec. 1 and is scheduled for completion May 31, 1967.

"The Texas Transportation Institute has been working on the project on the state level for about two and one-half years," Dean Benson pointed out. "We are pleased that TTI is getting national support for the study."

TTI's earlier study was in cooperation with the Texas Highway Department and the Bureau of Public Roads.

Benson said the national study may involve four or five separate research investigations.

The BPR announcement explained the objective is to design a support that will give way easily when struck by a car but will be strong enough to stand up against high wind.

Most obvious objective is highway safety. Bureau officials noted single vehicle collisions with fixed objects account for approximately 40 per cent of all fatal accidents on rural roads.

The BPR indicated the study will be directed also at determining the feasibility of providing safety devices to intercept, redirect and stop a vehicle when collision with a sign support is imminent and removal of that support by impact would permit overhead wires and other structures to fall. It will also concentrate on developing a design that will enable signs to be built with low wind resistance.

Budgeted amount for the first nine months of the study is \$216,000. It is to be met through federal-aid funds from these states, with no matching state funds: Alabama, \$20,000; California, \$40,000; Kansas, \$20,000; Louisiana, \$15,000; Minnesota, \$10,000; Mississippi, \$20,000; Nebraska, \$10,000; North Dakota, \$10,000; Oklahoma, \$6,000; South Dakota, \$5,000; Tennessee, \$20,000 and Texas, \$40,000.

Prof Receives \$14,400 Grant

Dr. Bardin H. Nelson, professor of sociology, has received a \$14,400 grant from the Agricultural Development Council. The grant will be used in support of one phase of Research Project S-1578 entitled "An Analysis of Attitudinal Patterns Toward Agriculture Program Development in Selected Foreign Countries."

Nelson will conduct basic socio-cultural studies to undergird program development in certain countries having formal contracts with Texas A&M the Agency for International Development or the Ford Foundation.

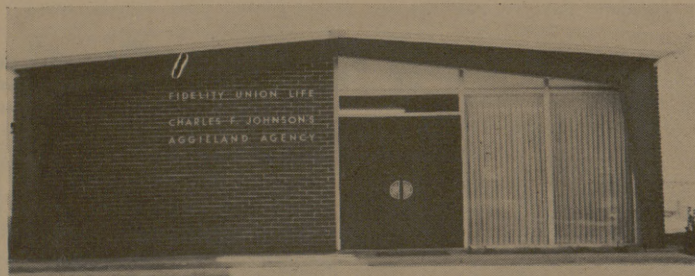
He plans to initiate work in the Dominican Republic and Thailand during the summer of 1966. He will also spend some time in Syria giving direction to field studies of Bedouins.

This research program will enable students from those foreign countries working toward higher degrees in agricultural economics or sociology to conduct research for their dissertation in their native land.

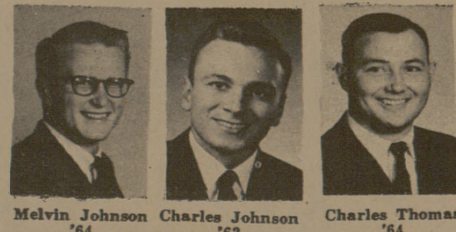
American students working toward degrees and desirous of careers in foreign service may also conduct their research in one of these countries.



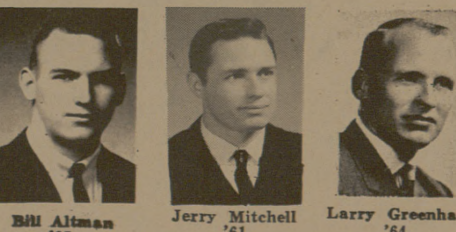
