They left for a later meeting the implementation of that part of the NCAA provision that pertains to maintenance of the minimum grade point average, which under the NCAA's new rule is 1.6. A 4.0 grade is the maximum, thus 3.0 would be B, 2.0 would

be C and 1.0 would be D. The new NCAA rule stipulates that all incoming athletes must have a predicted minimum grade point average of 1.6 to obtain an athletic scholarship and must maintain the same average in order to retain the scholarshap and participate.

In other action, the conference passed implementing legislation for policies on scholarship limitations approved previously.

Starting with February matriculation, athletic scholarships will be granted for a maximum of two years, subject to renewal.
