### Radios To Track Deer Developed At A&M

An electronics deer tracking project of Texas A&M's Wildlife Science Department has received \$22,000 in research renewals for 1965-66.

Jack Inglis, instructor in wildlife management and director of the study, said renewals include \$10,000 from the Welder Wildlife Foundation, \$6,000 from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, and \$6,000 from the Agricultural Experiment Station.

The project has been in progress for about two years at the Welder Wildlife refuge near Sinton. Goal of the research is to find additional information about deer.

"We mounted six transmitters on deer this summer and know their pitfalls now," he added. "The new transmitters are much improved."

Researchers use a "capture gun" with nicotene salicylate bullets to immobilize deer for attachment of collars and color tags on ears. In winter, door-drop traps are used.

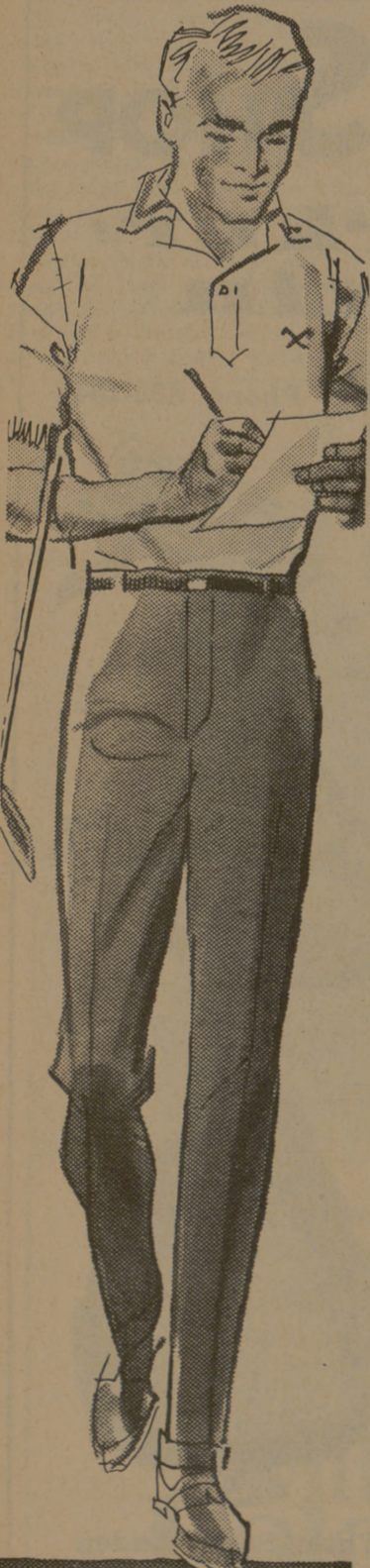

Wooten explained that the short course will be divided into five major areas consisting of pavements, structures, design and operation, maintenance and right of way. A sixth area to be covered will be management. These sessions will allow participation by the visitors through discussion

fresh bandmen in courses in which they need help.

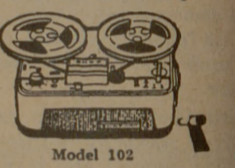
Wayne Dunlap, assistant professor of civil engineering, started coaching them this fall and did it out of his own pocket. But he doesn't have to pay for himself anymore.
