The act, as approved by the Congress and signed into law by President Johnson, envisions control of billboards and junkyards and scenic enhancement along the nation's federal-aid highway systems.

In Texas this will include the 3,027 miles of the Interstate highway system and 14,562 miles of the primary system, or a total of 17,589 miles.

The Texas Highway Commission now has directed that initial action be taken by the Texas Highway Department to comply with the intent and purposes of the act. Greer explained these steps as follows:

(1) A complete inventory of the outdoor advertising signs, displays and devices presently in place within 660 feet of the near-

(2) A similar inventory of junkyards leading to their removal or screening under the act.


