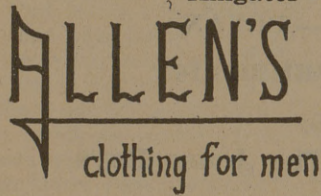

Tigers Close With Conroe

A & M Consolidated High School closes out its 1965 season here Friday night against Conroe.

The Tigers carry a 3-6 record into the game but could salvage an otherwise drab year by knocking off the district-leading Conroe eleven.

The Tigers have scored victories over Caldwell, Navasota and Hearne while losing to Beaumont, Houston Lanier, Honston Furr, Brenham, Cypress-Fairbanks and Huntsville.

"Our team lacks size and speed but our boys give 100% effort and stay in their all the way," said head coach Edsel Jones.

Jones said that the main defense is a wide tackle six, commonly called a six-two-three. The offensive setup consists of an unbalanced line with a split end and the backfield in an "I" formation.

A-1 Captures Grid Title By Downing Squadron 11

The A-1 Fish widened their lead with a 35-yard touchdown run by Seely. A pass to Clay Morgan made the score 14-0 at halftime.

Seely again broke open early in the second half for another touchdown run. A pass play to Reinecker made the score 21-0. Once again an interception by

A-1 stopped a Squadron 11 drive. Two plays later Seely uncorked a pass to Reinecker, who outran defenders for a 40-yard touchdown play.

The rainy, muddy field slowed things down considerably for both sides, but the A-1 Fish managed to stay on top throughout the entire game.

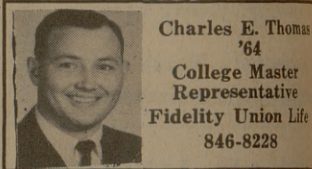
There were contingents from both units present, cheering on their favorites.

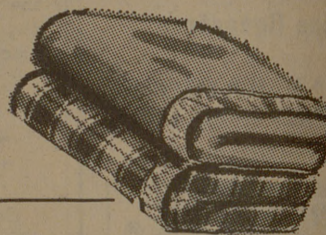

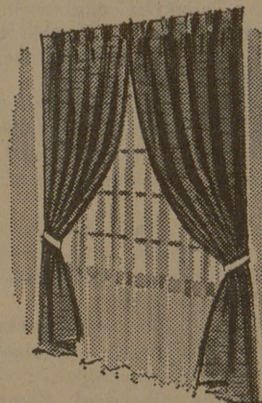

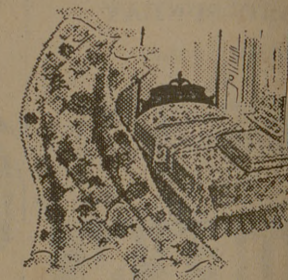
