A&M's top team fired 3,224 out of a possible 3,600. The University of Houston was second with 3,217. LSU placed third with 3,207. Twenty universities

and colleges competed. Christopher M. West paced the Aggie team with 827 out of 900 points possible. Carl E. Long posted 806, Jack G. Merrell Jr. and John Vogel were the other team members. Capt. A. G. Trass was officer in charge.
