# Natural Charm Shown By Mexican Delegate

Rosa Maria Romo is a diplomacy major but she already possesses a natural charm which can't be learned in school.

She is currently visiting the Texas A&M campus as a member of the International University of Mexico's delegation to SCONA XI.

The attractive, dark-eyed delegate considers SCONA a "perfect experience for all students from foreign countries" and adds, "I'm glad I came, I've really enjoyed it."

One of the main differences she has noticed between A&M and her own university is the large number of students here who live on campus.

"We only attend school during the hours of class," she notes, "I live on one side of Mexico City and the university is on the other side."

Like many of the SCONA delegates, Rosa comments on the friendliness of the A&M campus.

"The people here are very hospitable, and I have also noticed a spirit of community here."

This visit marks only the third trip she has taken to the United States. The first was a stop-over in Miami several years ago en route to Europe, the other was a more recent shopping trip to South Texas.

Her purpose this time is somewhat more serious and she brings a quick, keen mind to her task. Her opinions on Southeast Asia, this year's SCONA topic, are obviously thoughtful and carefully considered ones.

"I respect your opinion but I think the problem in Vietnam belongs to those people. I don't think United States troops should be there. The Vietnamese should choose their own future by themselves. I am for free determination and free elections in Vietnam."

Rosa believes that her opinion generally reflects the views of the rest of her delegation on the Vietnam question, and of most citizens of Mexico as well.

In speaking of her native country she says, "we are an underdeveloped country but we trying to acquire a culture, to better our economic situation, and to develop in all areas of human life."

Does any kind of beatnik or protest movement exist today in Mexico?

"No," answers Rosa, "we are not economically strong enough for people to be able to be beatniks, the country is still developing. In Mexico the students rebel mostly against the government."

To many Americans, the idea persists that girls in Mexico are always chaperoned on dates. Rosa flashes one of her engaging smiles at this notion.

"We are modern, not medieval

in Mexico," she explains, "in some cases there are still chaperones but not in mine. And men and women are the same the world over."

Rosa, whose father works as a petroleum engineer, is now in her third year of college. She needs two more years after this one to complete her degree be-

cause her major, diplomacy, requires five years of study.

Afterwards, she plans to continue her study in graduate school at the Colegio de Mexico. After finishing there, she hopes to work in international law or in some other field of foreign relations, possibly in the United Nations.
