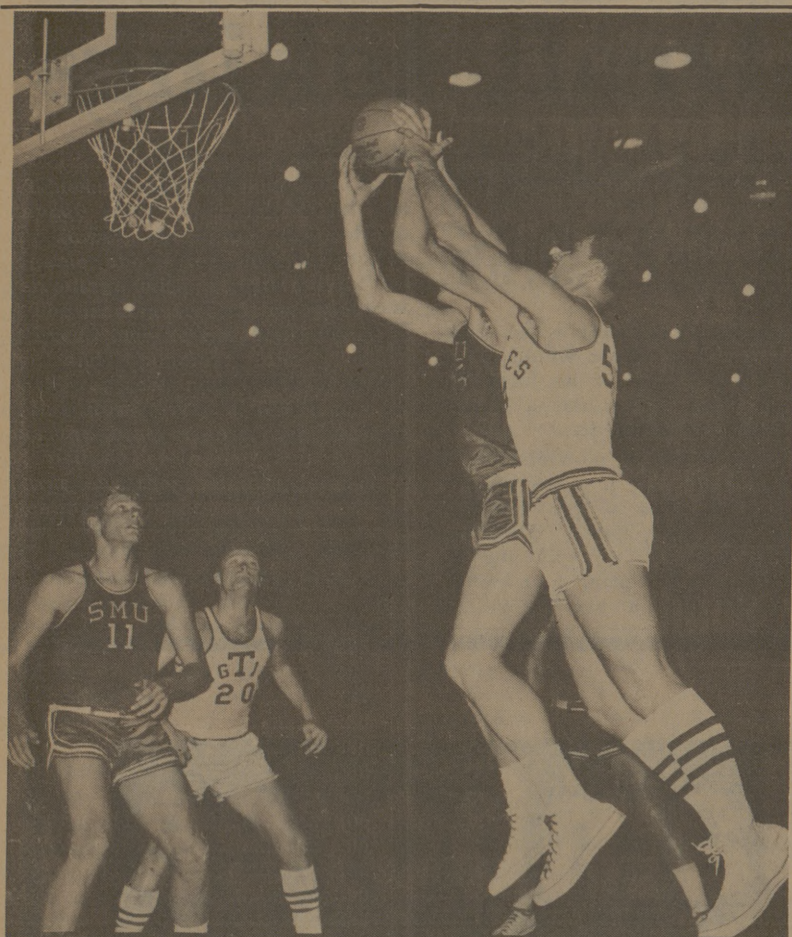

Sam Leads LSC In Prelim Games

 Sam Houston has the best non-conference won-lost record in early season basketball activity in the Lone Star Conference but it does not lead in any of the individual departments. Sam Houston will carry a 7-4 non-conference record into the start of league games this weekend. Howard Payne, with a 6-5 mark, is the only other team above the .500 level. Sam Houston and Howard Payne meet Saturday night at Huntsville. Conference statistics released Wednesday showed that Howard Payne's Dan Smith is the leading scorer, averaging 23 points a game, and is tops in field goal percentage with a .620 average. The leading free throw shooter is Fred Steele of Stephen F. Austin, and teammate Mike Cook is the top rebounder. Sul Ross, with a 6-6 record, has the best offense, averaging 37 points per game, and East Texas has the stingiest defense, yielding 65 points a game.
