Poet-playwright Gary Heilsberg has lost none of the drama of the period nor the stature of the man when he portrays Wilson as a fierce yet tender, wise yet foolish, but above all a tenacious man in his belief that world peace could be a reality.

60 Business Officials Expected For Executive Development Program

Sixty executives from 10 states will arrive Jan. 23 for the three-week Executive Development program.

A&M President Earl Rudder will welcome the business and industrial officials at a smorgasbord Sunday evening. Workshop sessions and guest speakers take over Monday through Feb. 11.

"The primary purpose of EDP is to help the executive become more effective in his present job and develop abilities for advancement to positions of greater responsibility," said Dr. John E. Pearson, director of the School of Business Administration.

The Memorial Student Center is headquarters for the 14-year-old course which has been attended by personnel of 150 firms, branches and government organizations.

Administrative action and decision-making will be considered by participants. General Time Corp. chairman Don G. Mitchell of New York is the first of 28 officers of national and Texas firms scheduled to lead workshop sessions.

Others include Frank R. Barnett, president of the National Strategy Information Center, Inc., New York; Edward J. Green, vice president of Westinghouse Air Brake Co.; Justin E. Hoy, vice president of Southwestern Bell Telephone Co., St. Louis, and A&M faculty members including Dr. J. P. Abbott, distinguished professor of English.

A&M organized the Executive Development Program in 1951 in cooperation with various companies.

Du Pont Awards Summer Grants
Grants for summer research totalling \$4,400 have been awarded Texas A&M by the Du Pont Company.

The grants of \$2,200 each are for teachers in chemical and mechanical engineering. Recipients selected by A&M are to be paid an amount equal to two months of their regular academic salaries and the balance supports the research work.

The gifts are part of \$2,200,000 awarded to 213 colleges and universities in Du Pont's annual program of aid to education.

Hensarling Receives Magazine Citation

A citation for outstanding editorial service on "Texas School of Business" has been presented Dr. Paul R. Hensarling, head of the Department of Education and Psychology.

He served three years on the Editorial Advisory Board of "Texas School of Business," news magazine for Texas school administrators within the state.

Dr. Grady Parker of A&M replaces Hensarling on the board after the department head's three-year term. Parker is professor of education and psychol-

ogy. Both men have been featured on the front cover of the magazine.
