

Team To Conduct Bat Expedition

A three-man research team from the wildlife science department will begin a research trip to Central America Feb. 4 to study taxonomy and distribution of bats.

Dr. Dillard C. Carter, assistant professor of wildlife science, is leader of the group, which includes a graduate student, Raul Valdez of El Paso, and an undergraduate student, David A. Christopher of Fort Worth.

He said the study will open the second year of a three-year \$35,000 grant from the National Science Foundation.

"This study will differ from the first year in that we are not looking for particular kinds of bats," Carter explained. "We are interested in determining where bats may be found, why they live in one place and not another, and other information about population."

Carter said the trio hopes to collect about 1,500 specimens of bats during the three-month trip.

A&M has more than 17,000 specimens of mammals, including bats, in its collections, probably the largest in the South.

The researchers will return to A&M about May 1.

The 18th Industrial Arts Teacher Education Conference will bring 600 persons to Texas A&M Feb. 24-26.



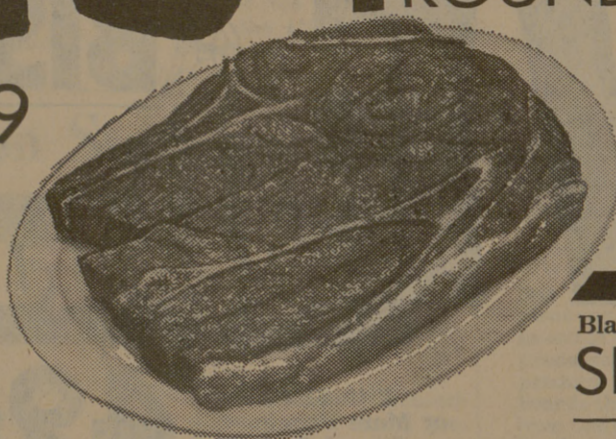


