Ags Meet Tech Tonight

By GERALD GARCIA The bubble burst for the Aggies and six other Southwest Conference teams started to dream.

Coach Shelby Metcalf's basketball squad, after knocking off seven straight conference foes, ran into a Texas Longhorn stampede Saturday night, 110-82, and had their conference lead reduced to two games with six to play.

The Aggies invade one of the toughest foreign courts at 8 p.m. tonight when they encounter the Texas Tech Red Raiders in Lubbock. Radio KORA will broadcast the game starting at 7:55 p.m.

With Tech's Dub Malaise back

in shooting form — he hit 43 points in losing to TCU Saturday — the Red Raiders could put another damper on the Aggies' pennant drive.

Tech is currently deadlocked with Baylor, Texas, Arkansas and TCU for third place, one game behind second-place SMU and three behind the league-leading Aggies. Only Rice (0-8) is out of the title picture.

An A&M loss to Texas Tech tonight, combined with an SMU win over Baylor, and the conference will have a race after all.

The Aggies had threatened to run away with the title, sweeping

their first seven conference games, before the Longhorns pulled the stops on the Aggie Express.

A&M will encounter three of the conference's top shooters in the High Plains of West Texas. The Red Raiders have Malaise, Norman Reuther and Bobby Measells listed among the top 10 scorers.

Malaise has a 19.6 average, while Reuther and Measells follow with 17.5 and 16.4 norms, respectively.

But the Aggies have the conference's most prolific scorer in John Beasley. Beasley is hitting

at a 28.6 clip per game. He will team with Randy Matson, Eddie Dominguez, Dick Rector and Dick Stringfellow in the Aggies' starting lineup tonight.

Noel Stout, a Lon Morris Junior College transfer, who claimed he had a "once-in-a-lifetime performance," paced the Longhorns. He connected for 33, hitting 10 in a row in a 22-minute period.

Even though Stout hit 33, he took second high scoring honors to Beasley. The 6-9 senior, teamed with Matson, for 57 of A&M's 82 points. Beasley hit 38 and Matson tossed in 19.

If the Aggies lose tonight to the Red Raiders, the dreams of the other conference teams, with the exception of Rice, will get brighter, but an A&M win will turn the dreams into nightmares.
