International Development contract has been signed by Texas A&M President Earl Rudder for the Chott Maria Agricultural College in Sousse, Tunisia.

The contract provides additional funds of \$378,680 for the Tunisian program through Oct. 31, The first contract was signed Oct. 26, 1962.

Eight A&M instructors under A. J. Abshire are assisting a Tunisian staff in training 167 students. Forty-two Tunisian students working toward B.S degrees are expected to graduate this spring, E. Paul Creech, assistant director and campus coordinator, reported.

Creech said Phase II of the program, including permanent-type housing for 500 students, should start by 1967. Pat Courtin and Joe Lemmons are in orientation at A&M to join the Chott Maria staff.
