

# 1933 Coed Try Denied

 "The conclusion is inescapable that the framers of the Constitution and the Legislature establishing the A&M College intended that said college should be a distinct and separate institution, not controlled or governed by any of the provisions relating to the government, regulation or control of the University of Texas," his judgment reads.  
 But probably the most important part of his judgment was the finding that the Board held complete authority in the matter of admitting students.

"If the Legislature has seen fit to declare in specific language the status of all the other institutions of learning . . . with the respect to the admission of both sexes, and with reference to A&M it remains silent, the only logical conclusion that can be reached is that the Legislature intended to leave to the discretion of the Board of Directors of said College the admission of girls and women to said institution."  
 "By reason of the fact that the Legislature established, recognized and maintained this institution for more than 50 years as

a boys' and young men's school," he continued, "and for the further reason that it has been recognized and considered throughout the land as such an institution, and because of its great contribution in helping build and mold this great Southwestern Empire, I do not feel authorized under the law to change its character by a decree of court."  
 The all-male status of Texas A&M was to remain free from serious jeopardy for another quarter century.

# Campus Briefs

## Aid Contract Renewed For Tunisian School

An extension of the Agency for International Development contract has been signed by Texas A&M President Earl Rudder for the Chott Maria Agricultural College in Sousse, Tunisia.  
 The contract provides additional funds of \$378,680 for the Tunisian program through Oct. 31, 1968. The first contract was signed Oct. 26, 1962.  
 Eight A&M instructors under A. J. Abshire are assisting a Tunisian staff in training 167 students. Forty-two Tunisian students working toward B.S. degrees are expected to graduate this spring. E. Paul Creech, assistant director and campus coordinator, reported.  
 Creech said Phase II of the program, including permanent-type housing for 500 students, should start by 1967. Pat Courtin and Joe Lemmons are in orientation at A&M to join the Chott Maria staff.

## Worth Friday

Mike Griffith, president of the AIAA chapter, said Dr. Harry Sweet, Professor Stanley H. Lowry and Prof. Charles A. Rodenberger will accompany students on the one-day trip.

At General Dynamics, AIAA members will view a film on the TF-111 jet aircraft and see its fabrication. The tour includes stops at computer-controlled milling and drafting machines, the TF-111 fabrication and assembly areas plus the mile-long assembly line.  
 The TF-111's control system test stand and a completed craft at a run station will conclude the schedule, Griffiths said.  
 The tour was arranged through H. L. Ellis Jr. of the General Dynamics Management Relations Engineering Division. The A&M chapter of AIAA makes two tours a year. The fall trip was to Rocketdyne in McGregor.

## Firemen To Meet To Plan School

Bystanders may get the idea the Chemistry Building is afire Feb. 26 when 150 firemen meet to plan the 1966 Texas Firemen's Training School.

Henry D. Smith, chief of the Firemen's Training Division of the A&M Engineering Extension Service, predicts last year's record 2,041 enrollment will be surpassed by approximately 100.

"This meeting is to review course content, proposed improvements, hear reports by group coordinators and determine equipment needs," Smith commented.  
 "We will probably borrow about \$300,000 worth of firefighting equipment from firms across the nation," Smith continued. "Most of the chemicals to be used will be donated by industry."

The Firemen's Training School is scheduled July 17-22 and the Industrial Fire Protection School July 24-29.

## Panel To Discuss Foreign Programs

A three-man panel will describe Texas A&M's International Programs project in Tunisia in a faculty seminar Friday.  
 The 3 p.m. seminar will be in the Architecture Building auditorium, announced Programs Coordinator Dr. M. T. Harrington. The panel will consist of Henry

Ross, campus coordinator of the Tunisian program in 1962-65; Pat Hall, international training officer of the Office of International Programs, and E. Paul Creech, assistant director and Tunisia program campus coordinator.  
 Hall recently returned from a two-year assignment at Chott Maria Agricultural College at Sousse, Tunisia. A&M has a 10-man staff at the college.  
 Forty-five Tunisian students are working toward B.S. degrees at A&M.

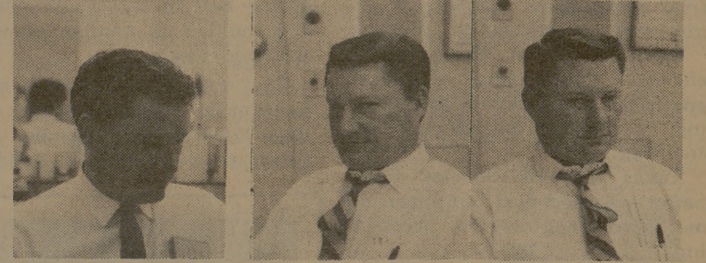
