Road Builders Group Names Benson Division President

College of Engineering Dean Fred Benson is the new president of the educational division of the American Road Builders Association.

Benson is one of six division presidents in the 5,000-member organization. The educational division has 400 members.

Research Ship Begins Geological Cruise

A geological cruise by Texas A&M's oceanographic research ship, the Alaminos, began Monday.

Visiting scientist Mario Gutierrez of the Geology Institute of Mexico will make the two-week cruise. William Bryant is chief scientist.

Research data will be gathered primarily through long coring and bathymeter measurements, Dr. Leo Berner of the Department of Oceanography said.

The Alaminos returned to Galveston last week from a two-week ocean temperature study cruise in the Gulf of Mexico.

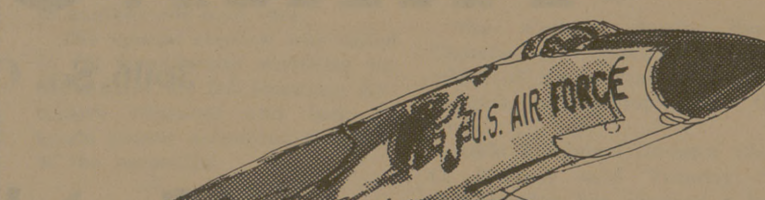
