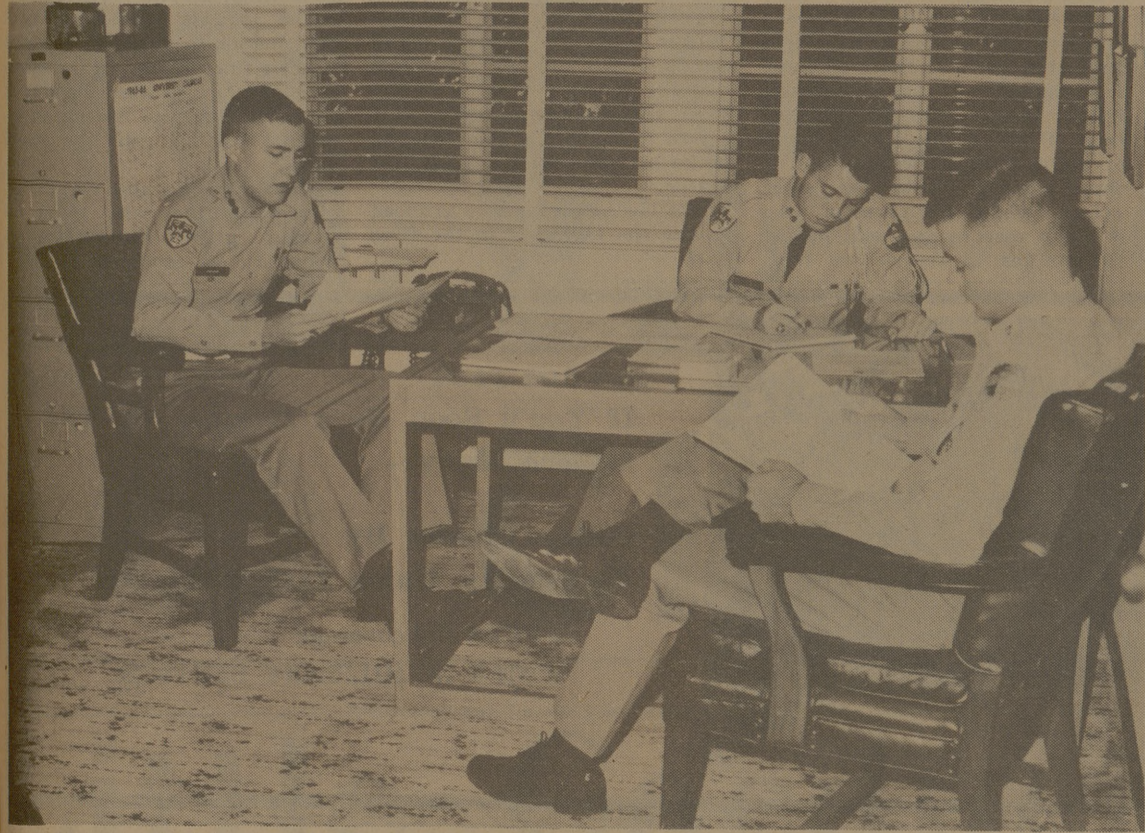


MSC Directorate Provides...

The Council shall administer the social and educational affairs of the Center and shall recommend to the appropriate administrative officers the allocation of funds budgeted for social and educational activities. Within College Regulations, the Council shall have the power to govern the activities of members, guests, and organizations in the building and may impose penalties for the abuse of privileges.

Memorial Student Center Committee: Memorial Student Center Committees shall plan to oversee the programs under their respective jurisdictions, submitting recommendations to the Council and carrying them into effect in cooperation with the Director and staff.

Memorial Student Center Directorate: The Chairmen of Committees shall be formed into a Memorial Student Center Directorate with such purposes, functions, and procedures as the Council may prescribe in the By-Laws.

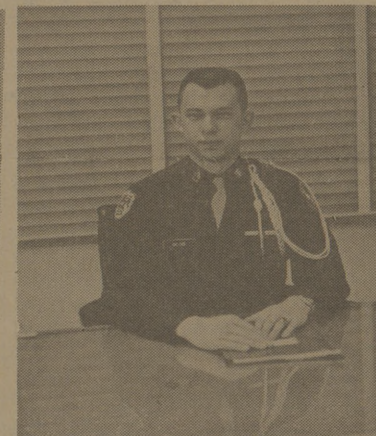

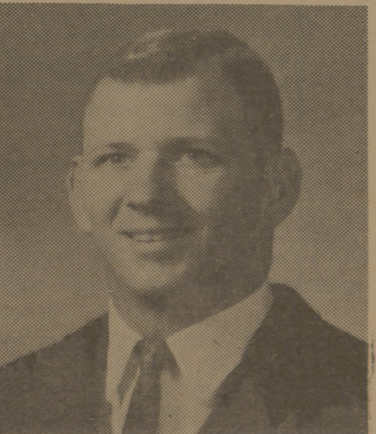
