

# Aggies Notch 2nd Straight

## Hillhouse Hurls Cadets Past Rattlers

Riding the limber left arm of pitcher Steve Hillhouse and a bundle of batting action, the Texas Aggie baseball team crushed St. Mary's, 11-1, Wednesday afternoon at Travis Park in Bryan.

Hillhouse and right-hander Ken Perrin held the outclassed St. Mary's nine to just two hits while the Aggie batmen swatted true 13 times to delight A&M's first hometown crowd of the season. Hillhouse hurled six innings and Perrin relieved for the final three.

Centerfielder Chuch Malitz led the Aggie express with three singles and catcher Joe Staples blasted a two-run homer. First baseman Billy Crain also contributed two singles to the Aggie runaway.

The Ags overpowered the Rattlers with a seven-run third inning which just about settled the whole affair. St. Mary's did manage to pull up to score their lone run in the top of the fifth inning. A&M lost only in the error column with four goofs to a single St. Mary's mistake.

The rout was the second straight win of the season. After the first three games were scrapped due to bad weather, the Aggies bounced Trinity, 8-2, in San Antonio Tuesday.

All-American Lance Cobb belted a double and a single for the Aggie cause and leftfielder Alan Koonce picked up two RBIs for good measure in the Trinity win.

A&M did its damage with three runs in the first inning, three in the second and two in the seventh, making the most of five hits. Trinity pounded its two runs in the fourth.

Right-hander Tommy Chiles chunked the first five innings to get credit for the win. Billy Johnson then came in to save the Aggie advantage.

Commenting on his team's early season performance, Coach Tom Chandler expressed wary confidence when he said, "It's so far so good. If we keep having good pitching, we will do all right. That's the important thing in this game."

## Beasley Receives Mention On AP All-American Poll

"Big John" Beasley, the most prolific scorer in Texas A&M basketball history, heads a four-man Texas aggregation on the honorable mention rolls of the Associated Press All-American squad.

Joining Beasley on the AP honor list are Texas Tech's little bomber, John (Dub) Malaise, Nevil Shed, stalwart star of the nation's second-ranked Texas Western, and the Houston Cougars' phenomenal sophomore, Elvin Hayes.

Big John sports a 27-point average and holds virtually all Aggie scoring and rebounding marks. The 6-9 senior from Kildare now stands third among all-time

Southwest Conference scorers as the Aggies close out the season tonight against Arkansas in Fayetteville.

Malaise, who made the Helms All-American Team last year, tied the SWC single game scoring record with 50 points against Texas University. Shed is the main cog in the Miner's rise to a spotless 24-0 record and Hayes is the youngster who leads the nation's highest scoring five. Houston has hit 100 points on 13 different evenings this season.

Beasley and Malaise also re-

ceived unanimous applause as repeating members of the United Press International All-Southwest Conference team. Also hitting for the second year is Carroll Hooser of SMU.

Darrell Hardy of Baylor and Charles Beasley of SMU, no relation to the Aggie ace, rounded out the honor five. John Beasley, Malaise and Hooser are seniors while Hardy and Charles Beasley are juniors.

Randy Matson polled the strongest vote among honorable mentions, while also included Ag co-captain Dick Stringfellow.

ORDINANCE NO. 454  
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE QUESTION OF REZONING LOTS 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, AND 9 OF BLOCK 1 TAUBER ADDITION FROM NO. 2 SECOND DWELLING HOUSE DISTRICT TO NO. 3 APARTMENT HOUSE DISTRICT.  
BE IT ORDAINED BY the City Council of the city of College Station, Texas: WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended that the land described herein be rezoned as No. 3 Apartment House District.  
It is hereby ordered that a public hearing shall be held in the City Hall at 7:00 P. M. on March 23, 1966, on rezoning certain areas within the city limits, more particularly described as follows:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN OLD HIGHWAY 6 AND NAGLE STREET, ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN BURRY STREET AND OLD HIGHWAY 6, ESTABLISHING A FOUR-HOUR PARKING LIMIT ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN NAGLE STREET AND ASBURY STREET, ALL IN THE CITY OF COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS.  
ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING FOR ONE BLOCK NORTH OF FM 60 ON ALL STREETS INTERSECTING FM 60 FROM THE NORTH BETWEEN OLD HIGHWAY 6 AND NAGLE STREET, INCLUDING ALL ORDINANCES IN EFFECT DIRECTING PUBLICATION PROVIDING A PENALTY.  
BE IT ORDAINED BY the City Council of the city of College Station that authority contained in the Charter of the city of College Station and the Statutes of the State of Texas, the following regulations concerning parking on FM 60 between Burry Street and Old Highway 6 and one block on all streets intersecting FM 60 from the North between Old Highway 6 and Nagle Street and including the said Nagle Street and Highway 6 are hereby fixed:  
In the best interest of public safety and movement of traffic and general good of the public the following parking areas established:  
(1) Two-hour parking on the North side of FM 60 between Nagle Street and Old Highway 6.  
(2) Two-hour parking on the South side of FM 60 between Asbury Street and Highway 6.  
(3) Four-hour parking on the North side of FM 60 between Nagle Street and Asbury Street.  
(4) Two-hour parking on both sides of all streets intersecting FM 60 between Nagle Street, Tauber Street, College Main Street, Boyett Street, North Highway 6, however, that such two-hour zone shall terminate for only one block North of FM 60 on all streets.  
(5) The two-hour parking limit shall extend four hours during the hours between 8 a. m. and 5:00 p. m. on all days except Sunday.

Ordinance No. 275 dated January 1965, and Ordinance No. 424 dated February 28, 1965, and all other ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.  
It is, therefore, Ordained that the parking areas be established and that appropriate signs be erected, that this ordinance be published in a newspaper of general circulation twice during the day period after its passage, and that due passing of this ordinance and enforcement of such signs, proper authorities be instructed to enforce such ordinance and anyone violating said parking limits shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

ORDINANCE NO. 453  
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN OLD HIGHWAY 6 AND NAGLE STREET, ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN BURRY STREET AND OLD HIGHWAY 6, ESTABLISHING A FOUR-HOUR PARKING LIMIT ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF FM 60 BETWEEN NAGLE STREET AND ASBURY STREET, ALL IN THE CITY OF COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS.  
ESTABLISHING TWO-HOUR PARKING FOR ONE BLOCK NORTH OF FM 60 ON ALL STREETS INTERSECTING FM 60 FROM THE NORTH BETWEEN OLD HIGHWAY 6 AND NAGLE STREET, INCLUDING ALL ORDINANCES IN EFFECT DIRECTING PUBLICATION PROVIDING A PENALTY.  
BE IT ORDAINED BY the City Council of the city of College Station that authority contained in the Charter of the city of College Station and the Statutes of the State of Texas, the following regulations concerning parking on FM 60 between Burry Street and Old Highway 6 and one block on all streets intersecting FM 60 from the North between Old Highway 6 and Nagle Street and including the said Nagle Street and Highway 6 are hereby fixed:  
In the best interest of public safety and movement of traffic and general good of the public the following parking areas established:  
(1) Two-hour parking on the North side of FM 60 between Nagle Street and Old Highway 6.  
(2) Two-hour parking on the South side of FM 60 between Asbury Street and Highway 6.  
(3) Four-hour parking on the North side of FM 60 between Nagle Street and Asbury Street.  
(4) Two-hour parking on both sides of all streets intersecting FM 60 between Nagle Street, Tauber Street, College Main Street, Boyett Street, North Highway 6, however, that such two-hour zone shall terminate for only one block North of FM 60 on all streets.  
(5) The two-hour parking limit shall extend four hours during the hours between 8 a. m. and 5:00 p. m. on all days except Sunday.

Ordinance No. 275 dated January 1965, and Ordinance No. 424 dated February 28, 1965, and all other ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.
