Prof Named Editor

Of Climatology Volume John Griffiths has been named an editor for "World Survey of Climatology," an encyclopedia to ducted the ceremony. be published in 12 volumes.

"This will be the most comprehensive encyclopedia of its kind," Griffiths commented. In collecting and editing articles for the 300-page African volume, the London - educated meteorlogist estimated he will be dealing with about a quarter-million words.

The A&M professor spent 12 years in Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, the Rhodesias and South Africa. He received his B.S. degree at Kings College of London in 1947 and the masters degree at Imperial College in 1949.


