and Tommy Chiles and Billy Johnson turned in fine early season pitching performances as the Aggies swept a doubleheader from the Sul Ross Lobos, 2-0 and 5-0, Tuesday afternoon at Bryan's Travis Park.

The twinbill sweep gave Coach Tom Chandler's Aggies an unblemished 6-0 record for the young campaign.

A&M will host the University of Houston Cougars at Kyle Field at 3 p.m. Thursday for the last non-conference game before Southwest Conference competition begins Saturday in Fort Worth against the Texas Christian Horned Frogs.

Both Chiles and Johnson looked in mid-season form as they hurled three-and five-hitters, respectively. The wins gave A&M a sweep of the three-game series with Sul Ross.

Chiles got all the support he needed in the fourth inning when second baseman Lance Cobb, A&M's all-American and all-conference performer, singled to left and later advanced to second. Crain then lined a single to left center field for the Aggies' first run.

Crain was also instrumental in A&M's second run of the seveninning first game. He singled to center for his second hit in three tries, stole second and raced home after two were out when catcher Joe Staples drilled a hit to left field.

Chiles, besides allowing only three hits, walked two and fanned six.

Chandler praised both of the pitchers for their outstanding performances.

"When you get good pitching, you are hard to beat and the way Billy (Johnson) and Tommy (Chiles) pitched . . . well, they just looked real good for this early in the year," Chandler said.

Johnson became the first A&M pitcher to go the full nine innings as he turned his second fine performance of the season. He pitched six strong innings against Texas Lutheran Thursday.

After the shaky first inning when a double play by the Aggie infield killed a major Sul Ross threat, Johnson took command of the Lobos.

The Aggies gave him all the runs he needed in the first when short stop Jeff Warren scored on a single by Crain. Cobb later added the second marker for the Aggies in the initial frame by racing home on a passed ball.

Crain doubled home two insurance runs in the sixth frame

The Aggies added their final tally in the seventh on a walk to right fielder Richard Schwartz, an error and a wild pitch.

Crain, who broke out of an early season batting slump, collected four hits in the doubleheader in seven trips to the plate.

John Poss, A&M's left fielder, turned in the fielding gem of the doubleheader as he made a lunging, back-handed stab of a long drive the Lobo's Kenny Richardson hit into the left field corner in the sixth inning.




Naturally, Casey was not lost for words.




