

Weather OK For Tourney

The weather outlook for the National Collegiate Parachute Meet this weekend at Hearne appears favorable, according to Texas A&M meteorologists.

Jim Lightfoot, weather station manager for the Department of Meteorology, indicated weather Thursday should be clear with scattered clouds at 3,000 feet. Winds from north - northwest should range from 8 to 10 knots in the morning and from 8 to 16 knots in the afternoon.

Friday's forecasts calls for clear weather, with northerly winds from 8 to 16 knots.

Saturday's prediction is for 12-knot winds in the morning, with gusts up to 25 knots in the afternoon.

Temperatures should range from 50 to 74 degrees during the meet, Lightfoot noted.

One hundred parachuters from 13 universities and colleges throughout the nation will begin competition at 7 a.m. Friday and Saturday. Practice jumps are slated today.

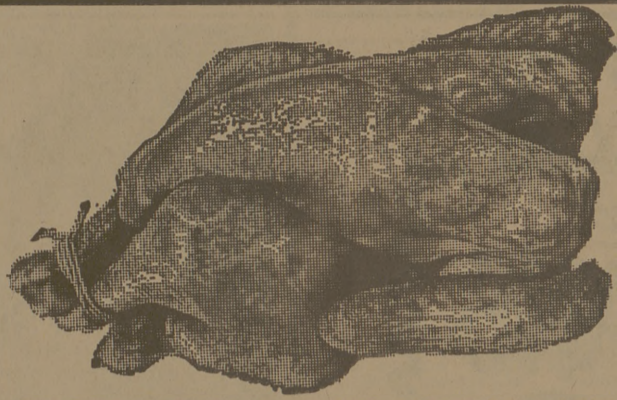

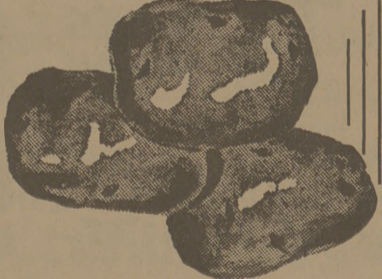
