**Biochemistry Prof Named
 To Chemists Society Post**

Dr. Raymond Reiser, distin-
 guished professor in the Depart-
 ment of Biochemistry and Nutri-
 tion, has been elected vice presi-
 dent of the American Oil Chem-
 ists Society.

Reiser has been active in the
 AOCs for many years. He was
 on the Board of Governors from
 1961 to 1963, and was nominated
 for the vice presidency in 1964.

Dr. Carl M. Lyman, head of
 the Department of Biochemistry
 and Nutrition, said Reiser is in-
 ternationally known for his re-
 search on the chemistry of fats
 and oils and relationships of fats
 (lipids) on diet and heart dis-
 ease in humans.
