Postmaster Urges Withdrawal Of Postal Savings Documents

Postmaster Ernest Gregg today urged depositors with postal savings certificates to withdraw their accounts from post offices as soon as possible or as soon as anniversary dates on their certificates are reached.

The Postal Savings System was abolished March 27, with the signing of Public Law 89-377 by President Johnson.

Gregg pointed out that as of today, no deposits can be accepted and no new accounts can be opened. He said that interest will end on the anniversary date of each certificate.

The Postmaster added that for convenience all certificates held by depositors may be cashed at the same time and interest will be paid for each full month they have been outstanding beyond three months from the interest date.

The Postal Savings System was established January 1, 1911, to get money out of hiding and to attract savings of a large number of immigrants who were accustomed to saving at post offices in their own country.

It also served as a safe depository for people who had lost confidence in private banks.

Today, however, with the growth of banking facilities paying much higher interest rates than the 2 per cent interest per annum paid on postal savings, the System has outlived its usefulness.

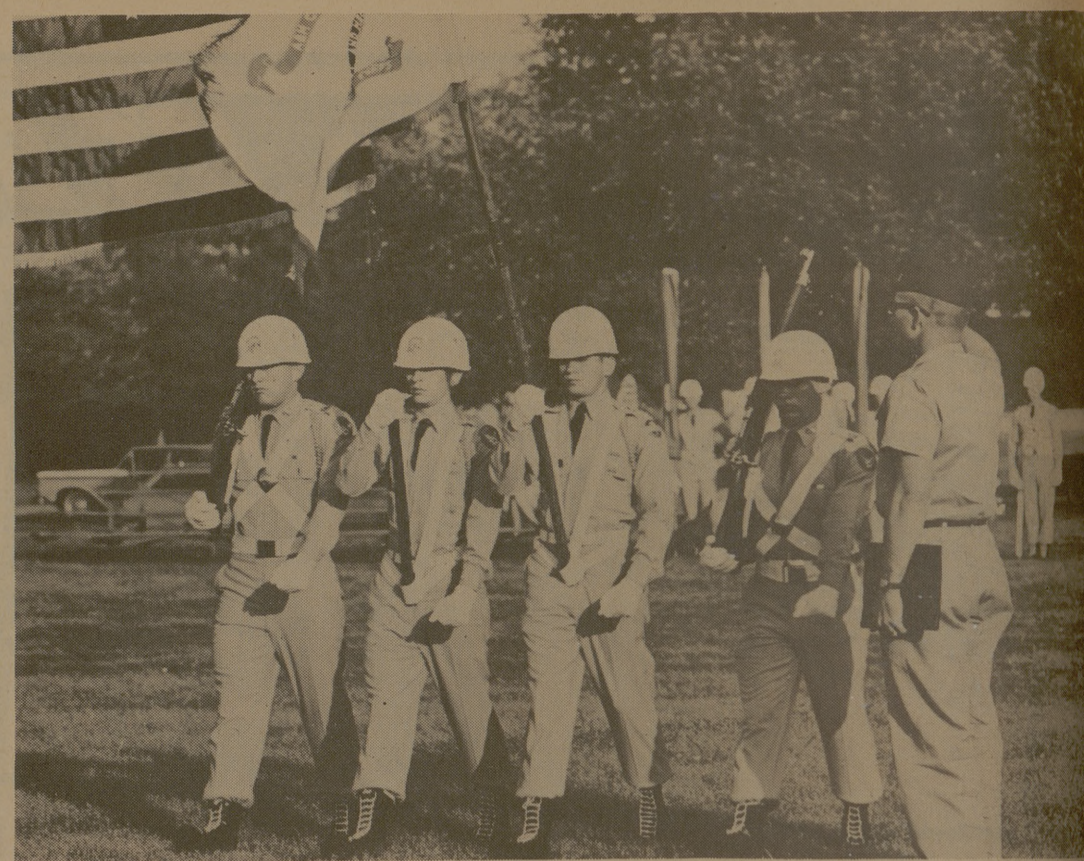
Gregg said as of June 30, 1965, there were 997,029 depositors holding certificates in 3,130 post offices through the nation. The number of depositors has been declining at a rate of about 6,500 per month.

The Postmaster said that unpaid deposits remaining in the post office beyond June 30, 1967, would be transferred to the Treasury Department in a trust fund and would be available for payment without time limitation whenever proper claims are received.

School Board Workshop Scheduled For Monday

School board members from 21 Texas counties meet here Monday for a regional workshop.

Sponsored by the Department of Education and Psychology, the Texas Association of School Boards workshop will study public education in an eight-hour program at the Ramada Inn. About 200 will attend, estimated coordinator Dr. Grady P. Parker.

Penrose B. Metcalfe, attorney, member of the State Board of Education from San Angelo and a 1916 A&M graduate, and Donald G. Nugent, association executive director, are principal speakers.

Metcalfe will speak on the workshop theme, "Agenda for Action for Public Education" during the opening session. Nugent will discuss "The Workshop Plan."

Registration is at 1 p. m., the opening session at 2:30 and seven workshops begin at 3:30. A 6:30 p. m. buffet dinner will be followed by a panel moderated by Department of Education and Psychology Head Dr. Paul Hensarling.

Session reports will conclude the program. An additional topic, "Property Evaluation, Tax Assessment and

Collection," is scheduled on state and federal activity in public education, board - superintendent-teacher relations, schoolboards, adult education and school problems.

Entertainment in the opening session will be provided by Bryan school students, under Jim Austin's direction.

Student AIE Chapter Wins Award In National Contest

The student chapter of the American Institute of Industrial Engineers has won first place in national competition for the outstanding student chapter, according to Dr. Glen Self, adviser.

The award, to be presented May 28 at the National AIEE Convention in San Francisco, is the Wyllys G. Stanton Award for the Outstanding Student Chapter. More than 100 student chapters throughout the nation competed for the award.
