

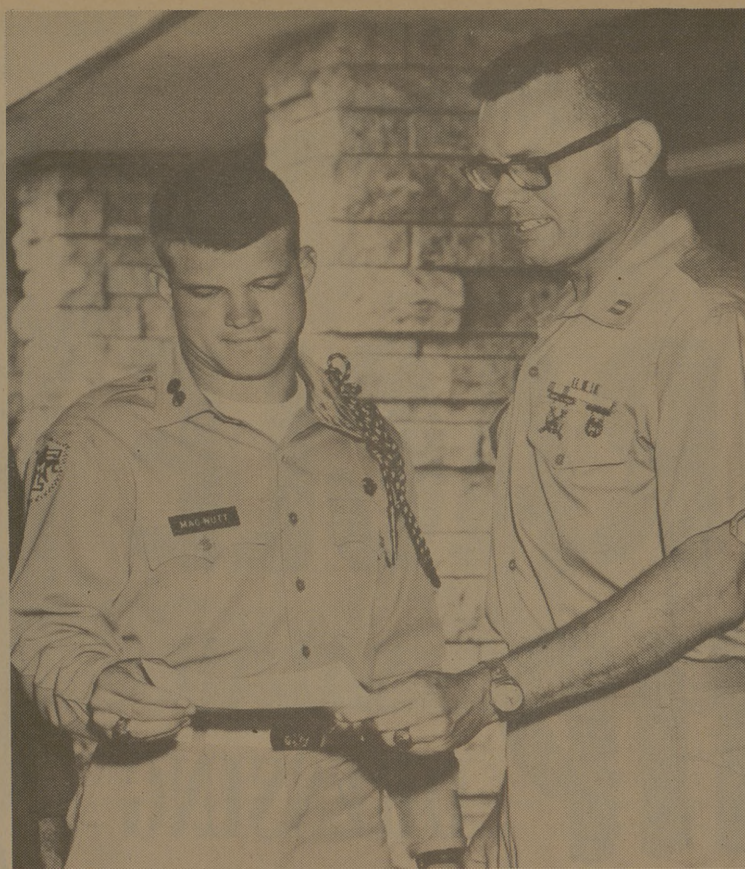
Earle Appointed ASEE Chairman

Dr. James H. Earle, associate professor of engineering graphics, has been elected chairman of the Texas A&M chapter of the American Society of Engineering Educators.

Other officers chosen include Dr. George Thompson of mechanical engineering, vice chairman; Dr. Howard Furr of civil engineering, secretary, and Dr. Richard Thomas of aerospace engineering, named membership chairman.

Earle replaces Dr. P. T. Eubank of chemical engineering as chairman.

Turnover Expected In Summer Jobs

Summer employment of students is a hustling business at the Student Aid Office.

Job turnover activity will peak during summer school registration, though vacancies created by graduates are usually filled in advance.

Availability of work is good for enrolled students who qualify under work study requirements, according to Student Aid Director Robert M. Logan. Qualifications are based on need.

"We can provide jobs for enrolled students wanting fulltime employment," Logan said.

High school students may check the job list in the Placement Office, Room 303, YMCA, but enrolled job seekers are placed through the personnel office.

Logan estimated 25 per cent of enrollment works parttime or fulltime, on and off campus. Students work as student assistants, graders, file workers, typists, librarians, lab assistants, research process assistants, technical repairmen, waiters and custodians
