

Education Institute Scheduled For Teachers This Summer

An Institute for Teachers of the Educationally Deprived is scheduled for 100 public school teachers July 18-August 26.

Headed at experienced teachers who instruct less advantaged children, the institute covers a target of President Johnson's poverty program in education, indicated Department of Education and Psychology head Dr. Paul Hensarling.

This state program will have an important impact on national programs upgrading levels of education," Hensarling noted.

Federal funds administered through the Texas Education Agency will pay institute expenses, tuition and fees.

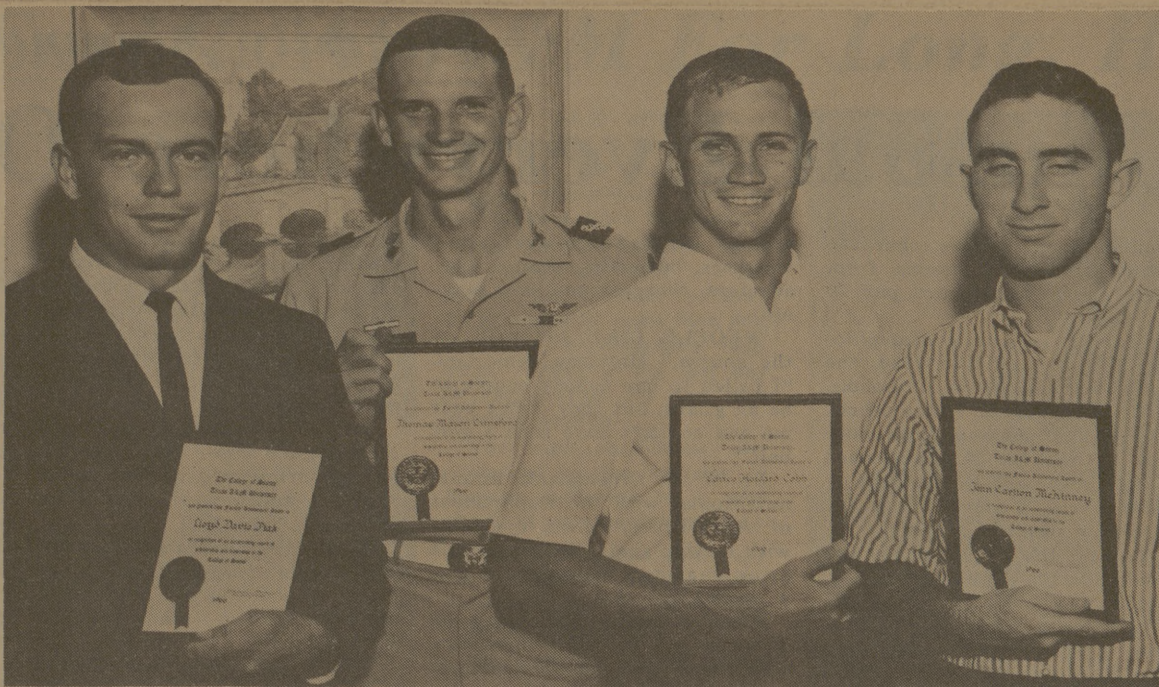
DR. WALTER Varvel, psychology professor, directs the six-week institute coinciding with A&M's second summer session. Instructors will be Dr. William Robinson, educational psychologist, and Dr. William H. Graves, specialist in reading instruction. Several professors will serve as consultants.

"Main emphasis will be placed on cultural, psychological and sociological backgrounds for teachers to understand students with which they have most difficulty," Dr. Varvel commented.

He indicated 100 teachers accepted by individual application will come from schools in which low-income family children are taught. Institute participants from within a 50-mile radius of College Station will primarily be lower elementary grade and junior high teachers.

TEACHERS completing the course will earn six hours of college undergraduate credit. Psychology 634, Principles of Human Growth and Development, and Education 6104, Psychological Foundations of Reading Disability, will be adapted for institute use, Varvel added.

Classes from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. will be held in the Military Science Building. Small group discussions, films, videotape and consultants will be employed in instruction in psychology, sociology, education and language problems.

Traffic Engineering Expert Joins TTI Design Division

Dr. Vergil G. Stover, an experienced teacher and researcher in traffic engineering and transportation planning, will join the Highway Design and Traffic Engineering Department of the Texas Transportation Institute and the Transportation Engineering and Transportation Science Division of the Department of Civil Engineering June 1.

The announcement was made jointly by Prof. Charles J. Keese, executive officer of TTI, and Dr. Charles H. Samson, department head.

Stover received the Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering and commerce at Ohio State in 1958. He received MS and Ph.D. degrees in Transportation Engineering from Purdue in 1960 and 1963, respectively.

Technical societies and organizations of which he is a member include the Institute of Traffic Engineers, Sigma Xi, the South Carolina Planning Association, the Regional Science Association, and the American Society for Engineering Education.

STOVER IS also a member of the Highway Safety Committee of the Highway Research Board and a registered professional engineer. He has served on the Greater Columbia Safety Committee and as technical advisor to the South Carolina Traffic Safety Council.

In his work at A&M he will participate in TTI research projects involving traffic assignment conducted cooperatively with the Texas Highway Department and the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads.

Registration Swimming Course Closes Friday

Registration for the first six week session of the summer swimming program will end Friday.

Anyone interested may register from 4-5:30 p.m. Thursday or Friday in the P. L. Downs Natatorium. Classes will begin Monday.

All registrations must be made in person with \$4 charged for residents and \$8 for non-residents.

Beginning swimmers must be at least six years old and are required to be 51 inches tall or able to swim 30 feet.

Meeting twice weekly the competitive swimming program will be carried on at three levels.

The pre-competitive division is open to children under ten years old who can swim 60 feet, junior competitive for 10-12 year-olds and senior competitive for the 13-18 group.

7 Cadets Receive Army Grants

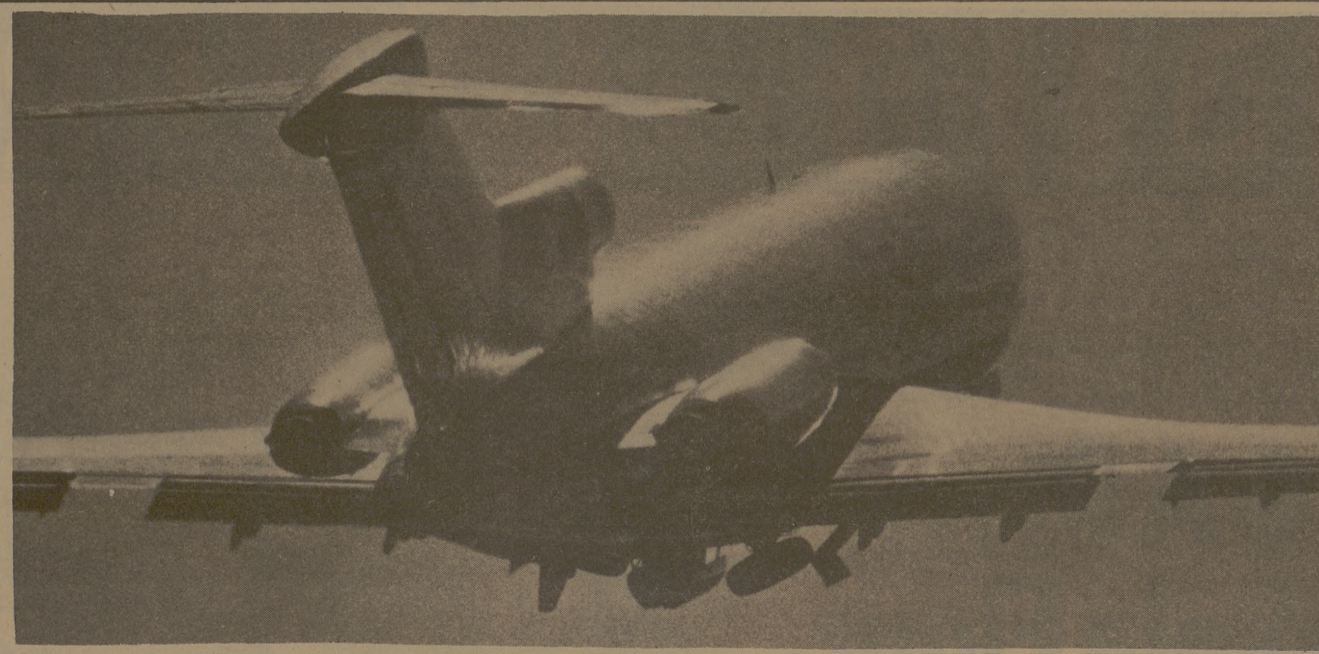
Seven of Texas' 79 two-year Army ROTC scholarships have been awarded to Texas A&M sophomores.

Col. D. L. Baker, Professor of Military Science, announced the grants.

Each scholarship covers tuition and fees for two years, provides an annual book budget of \$100 and a \$50 per month subsistence allowance. Cadets may select any course of study. Upon graduation each will be commissioned a second lieutenant in either the Regular Army or the Army Reserve and will serve a four-year active duty tour.
