

## Hubert Elected Vice President Of SWEDC

Dr. Frank Hubert, College of Liberal Arts dean at Texas A&M, has been named vice president of a non-profit educational corporation to serve Texas and Louisiana.

Hubert also is a member of the board of directors of the Southwest Educational Development Corporation, headquartered in Austin. Other Texas board members include Commissioner of Education J. W. Edgar and University of Texas Chancellor Harry H. Ransom, among others.

The corporation is recipient of a \$216,000 contract by the U. S. Office of Education for development of new approaches to inter-cultural education in a regional institution to be instigated by the SEDC, according to a news release.

Dr. Edwin Hindsman of Austin has been named executive director of the corporation. Hindsman emphasizes that the research-oriented institution will neither supplant nor infringe upon responsibilities of existing institutions.

### Bodine To Attend Michigan Conclave

Dr. Willis R. Bodine, chief instructor of Civil Defense Training at Texas A&M, will attend the Office of Civil Defense Staff College July 14-29 at Battle Creek, Mich.

Plans call for demonstration projects in elementary and secondary levels of education, with task force operations probing problems via new approaches.

### Stokes Writes Magazine Article

Dr. William W. Stokes of Texas A&M has an article entitled "An Analysis of Learning by Discovery" in the March issue of the "Florida Journal of Educational Research."

The 26-page examination of discovery techniques used in teaching outlined various approaches used and reviewed three types of "discovery" teaching discussing the degree of choice given students in each.

Stokes is an assistant professor in the Department of Education and Psychology.

## Norwegian School Different, NSF Speaker Reveals

Norwegian secondary schools force pupils to select a field of study at 15 years of age and have a built-in "drop-out" factor, revealed Norse geophysicist Dr. Egil Hestvedt Tuesday night.

He spoke to National Science Foundation summer institute participants on "Secondary Education in Norway" at Texas A&M.

Following seven years elementary school, pupils pass to "real-school" by examination. During two years of U. S. equivalent high school, Norwegian teenagers take standard courses in religion, languages, history, geography, chemistry, physics and math, Hestvedt said.

Another major exam—standardized throughout the country—permits students to enter a three-year "gymnasium" at the age of 15. Tests are administered at the end of each year and no other exams are given.

About 50 per cent of Oslo stu-

dents entering "real-school" rigid exams to enroll in the nasium. At this point, the becomes a student and the line of study.

Most popular are the English-lines, he noted. The studies prepare students for science, veterinary medicine, faculty of science or technical high school. The lines are mathematics, physics, sciences. Math carries the weight through algebra, trigonometry and analytic geometry.

"When students enter the final three years," Dr. Hestvedt explained, "they begin the program for university study of history, or science or a technical school program."

The Norwegian government bears all educational expenses except a \$7 fee for examination and books. Dr. Hestvedt's loans are easily arranged in room and board.

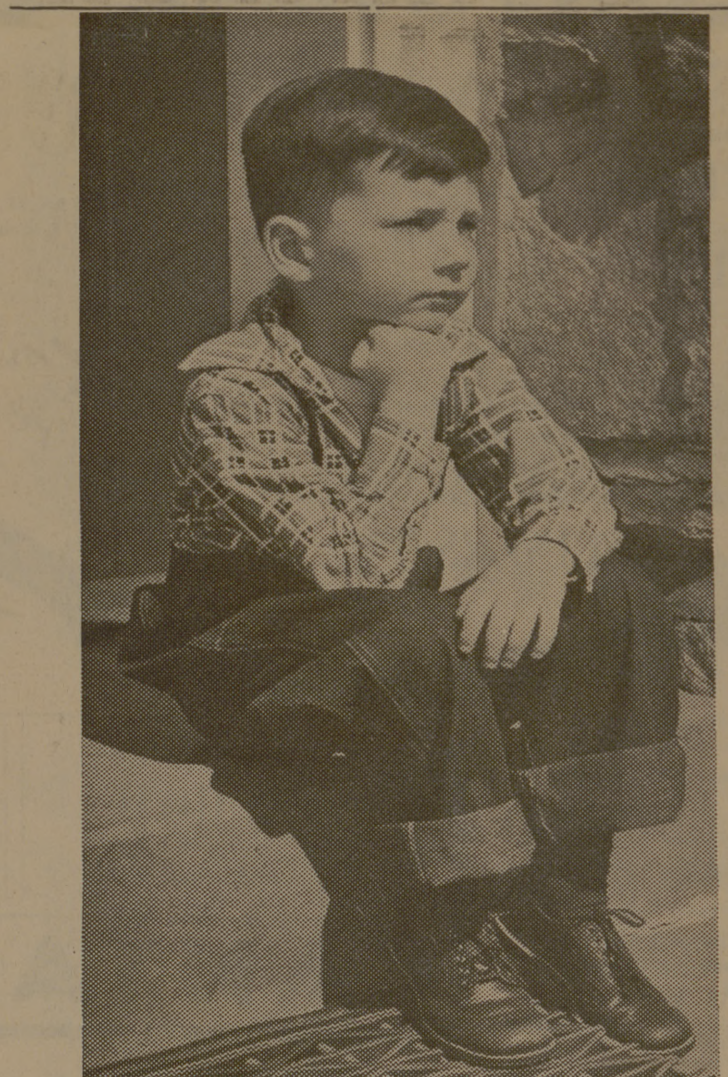
