Community Service Seminars Scheduled In Fall At A&M

Community problems of financing, management, personnel, and budgeting will be scrutinized in community service seminars at Texas A&M this fall. City managers from the Beaumont-Port Arthur-Orange area will hold the first session of the 11-week program in September. Interaction between university faculty, government officials and private citizens will produce significant benefits to the state and its communities," announced project co-director Claude A. Bitner.

Political science and business administration faculty will be involved initially, Bitner noted, but interdisciplinary participation is sought. "Goals call for a seminar in each of the 1966-67 semester, two in the summer of 1967 and three during the 1967-68 term," Bitner noted. Regions expected to participate in future seminars include Tyler-Marshall-Lufkin and Corpus Christi-Brownsville-Laredo areas.

Financed with assistance of a title 1 grant of the 1965 Higher Education Act, seminars are extended and planned to expand into other occupational and geographic areas. Allen G. Pulsifer, also a professor in the Department of Economics, co-directs with Bitner. Participants — including community leaders and local government policy-makers — will be designated Visiting Fellows and given faculty privileges, clerical and research assistance. Seminar relations with university personnel will be on a reciprocal education basis, not in the traditional student-teacher fashion.

"Seminars will be conducted as meetings of equals," Bitner stressed, "bringing together diverse interests, experience, information and competencies for organized exchange of information and ideas on specific problems. The combination of academicians' theoretical knowledge and fellows' practical experience will enrich all participants."

Short term, practical community service proposals will be selected by fellows. Two-day meetings once a month will be held at A&M for about 60 hours of seminar activity. During the first part of the four-month period, nine fellows and three faculty members will identify urban problems of interest to each fellow, probable cause, previous solutions and relation to other problems.

Detailed plans applicable in each community will be prepared

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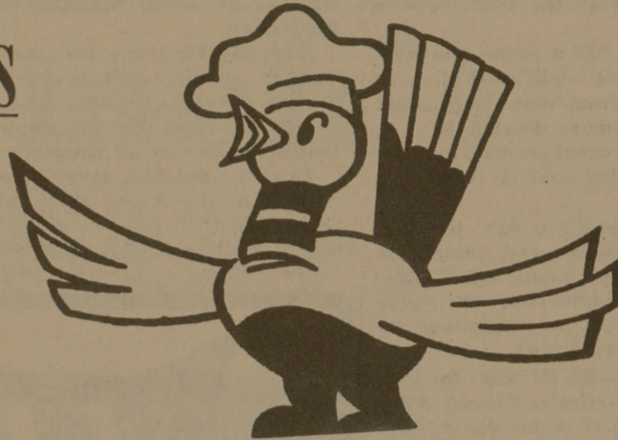
