About 300 cowmen, animal scientists and persons in allied industries will attend Texas A&M's 16th annual Beef Cattle Short Course Aug. 15-16.

and professor in the A&M Animal Science Department, said discussions will center on outlook, intensive beef production, feeding and breeding.

Talks start at 9:15 a.m. in the Memorial Student Center with O. D. Butler, Department of Animal Science head, outlining the present and future of the Texas beef industry.


Foreign Student Enrollment Off
