Lions Head To Visit Clubs Here

Lions District Gov. E. B. Mayer of La Grange will conduct his official visit with the College Station and Bryan-College Station Lions Club Monday.

He is governor of District 23 of Lions International, which is composed of 20 counties in South Central Texas with 54 Lions clubs consisting of over 2,000 members. He is also chairman of the Texas Council of Governors of the Lions International.

While here Mayer will meet with Lions Club officials to discuss their organization's program of work. He will also address the Lions Club at its regular meeting. Mayer has been a member of the La Grange Lions club since 1946; he was President 1963-64, zone chairman of District 23 1964-65.

Mayer has been president of the La Grange Chamber of Commerce, the La Grange Jaycees, the National Dairy Mart Association, and the Texas Frozen Food Locker Association, and Commander of the American Legion. He is vice president and General Manager of Consolidated Smokehouse and Frozen Food Lockers, Inc., owner of Mayer's Dairy Mart Stores, and a director of the First National Bank of La Grange. He attended the Lions International Convention in 1960 and 1966.

Demonstration Scheduled For 'Fury Fencer'

Two demonstrations of the "Fury Fencer," a tractor-drawn machine which takes most of the drudgery out of fence building are set for Wednesday by Texas A&M.

L. M. Schake of the A&M Department of Animal Science said the demonstrations are scheduled for 10 a.m. until 12 a.m. and 1 p.m. at the Research and Development Annex, formerly the Bryan Air Force Base.

He said the Fury Fencer is pulled by a standard farm tractor and operated by two men. It eliminates much of the hard labor associated with erecting wire fences on farms, ranches and along highways and railroad rights-of-way.

The machine drives either steel or pressure-cresoted wood posts, unrolls wire, stretches it and puts the fence up two to three times faster than conventional methods. Fury Fencer handles net wire, barbed wire in combination with net, or as many as four strands of barbed wire alone. Operation is effective on steep slopes or on level ground.

Schake said the demonstrations will be conducted by Paul Stroup of Pittsburgh, Pa., and Edwin A. Kinne of Denver, Colo., agricultural marketing representatives for the United States Steel Corporation, which developed the machine. The Fury Fencer to be used is owned by Henry Seale, Bryan area rancher.
