Demonstration Scheduled For 'Fury Fencer'

Two demonstrations of the "Fury Fencer," a tractor draw machine which takes most of the drudgery out of fence building are set for Wednesday by Texas A&M.

L. M. Schake of the A&M De partment of Animal Science sai the demonstrations are schedule for 10 a.m. until 12 a.m. and 1p.m. at the Research and Deve opment Annex, formerly the Bry an Air Force Base.

He said the Fury Fencer pulled by a standard farm tractor and operated by two men. eliminates much of the hard labo associated with erecting wil fences on farms, ranches and along highways and railroad rights-of-way.

The machine drives either stee or pressure-cresoted wood posts unrolls wire, stretches it and put the fence up two to three time faster than conventional methods Fury Fencer handles net wire barbed wire in combination with net, or as many as four strand of barbed wire alone. Operation is effective on steep slopes or on level ground.

Schake said the demonstrations will be conducted by Paul Strom of Pittsburgh, Pa., and Edwin A Kinne of Denver, Colo., agricul tural marketing representatives for the United States Steel Cor poration, which developed the machine. The Fury Fencer to be used is owned by Henry Seale, Bryan area rancher.
