From Gilmer in the east, to Raymondville in the south, westward to Muleshoe, Hereford in the north, and Vernon to the northeast, Hall teaches principles of electricity and applied electricity.

His job is to help cooperative employees qualify for more advanced telephone training courses at A&M's Telephone Training Center, a division of the Engineering Extension Service.

When he's not teaching, the veteran telephoneman confers with plant superintendents, helping strength supervisory skills and discussing training and job problems.

A native of Lohn, near Brady, Hall has headed A&M's itinerant telephone training program for almost five years during which times he averages 175 days and nights away from home base in Bryan

Hall conducts a plant school telephone ceminar att he A&M Research Annex every year. This year's seminar is scheduled in December under sponsorship of telephone cooperatives.

The King has 12 years experience with telephone cooperative programs. An Air Force veteran, he attended the USAF Radio Repair School. He also studied petroleum engineering at Schriener Institute, Tarleton State College and the Universtiy of Texas.
